## Project playground squeezes out \$1,000

A parent teacher group in Acton raised another \$1,000 for Project Playground for M.Z. Bennett Public School.

The group sold 270 cases of cider for the playground, bringing their total to \$2,000. The cider was sold on Saturday between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. to those who ordered it.

Parents have taken on the project because the Halton Board of Education was unable to finance a new playground at the school, said Phil Miller, a parent. Howard Allen, the principal of M.Z. Bennett, called the parents together in the hope they would form a group to raise money for the project. The group was formed in October.

Saturday's effort was the second project undertaken by the parent teacher group. Another \$2,000 is needed before they reach their goal of \$10,000.

Organizers of Project Playground were helped with their cider sale by Chudleigh's of Milton who supplied the cider at a reduced cost, Mr. Miller said.

If you are interested in the playground project and would like to attend the next meeting or donate money, call Mr. Allen at M.Z. Bennett at 853-0530. They could use help preparing their new fund-raising effort, Mr. Miller said.

the Minister has listened to our representations and responded in this way.
