# Soccer season taking shape

## Soccer

Registrations last Saturday of players - coaches - referees totalled 411 - 27 - 6 respectively. The number of players translates into almost 30 teams at this stage. The number of fields available translates into almost 80 scheduled games per week. The shortfall in coaches is likely to be made up without too much trouble due to the club system of filling gaps. The shortfall of referees is more difficult. As the numbers stand the shortage means 13 games for each official - which is an impossible task. In the words of new soccer club president, Dave Maloney, "This is our major area of concern this year." What is encouraging is the number of potential new and young referees. Six potential members were recruited. Another encouraging sign came from George Baines' questionnaire on coaching. Should coaches be required to be certified and qualified? 100 per cent yes replies. Should potential coaches be required to attend mandatory clinics? 100 per cent yes replies again. So much so, that

The soccer club will have an under-21 representative side again this season and shall play in the second division of the Peel Halton league due to there only being three other under-21 teams in the district. The other rep sides are at minor peewee and junior levels. These three groups are already entered in the Peel Halton leagues and players who wish to be considered should also contact George Baines at this stage to find out gym times, coaches and other details. George also would like it known that there is a coaches and managers meeting on Tuesday, April 21 in St. Andrew's Church Hall at 7:30 p.m. The house league drafts are on Sunday, April 26. Therefore attendance at the Tuesday evening session is important. Usually the first few columns of the year are full of calendar facts
