# Garden Gossip

Return to winter, temperaturewise anyway. It really must be spr-ing or nearly so, the Red-winged Blackbirds and Brown-headed Cow birds are back.

If you are still poring over seed and garden catalogues, the flower arrangers among you might keep in mind some of the flowers to plant that can be dried or otherwise preserved for arranging next winter. Among some of the best for air drying (the easiest) are Strawflowrs, Yarrow, Chinese lanters, Coxcomb, Blue Sage, Globe thistle, Honesty or silver penny, Larkspur, poppy heads both Orien-tal and California, Sea holly, Seum, Statice and many others. These kyou

can just hang to dry.

Gather material on a dry day.

Some such as Golden rod and Pearly everlasting should have the stems stripped of leaves first before drying. Group into small bunches and hand upside down. Herbs can also be air dried by hanging as can many wildflowers such as Queen Anne's Lace, Sumac, Mullein, Rose hips and others. Teasels are great in arrangements as are milkweeds and cattails.

There are, of course, other methods of preserving plant materials. Pressing flowers and leaves is one of the oldest. Foliage can be glycerine treated and many flowers even delicate ones can be preserved in
