Tournament gets off to excellent start

Aside from a 20-minute delay in game times, and a minor problem with ice conditions, the Georgetown International Bantam Hockey Tournament got underway Saturday without any setbacks.

Divisional play continues this week with playoffs slated to begin Friday. Then, on Saturday, the divisional champions will be decided as the preliminary step in determining

the two teams that will go head-to-head for the tournament's grand championship.

The delay in games Saturday came about when a Mississauga player was injured and required careful attention.

Wayne Pries, chairman of the tournament committee said they had allowed an additional 15 minutes leeway in the middle of the day, which meant they were not thrown off their schedule to a great degree.

A problem with "soft ice" presented itself Saturday afternoon, but Pries said by cutting back on the use of heaters, and changing their

ice flooding times, the playing surface at the Alcott Arena was quickly put back in order.

Georgetown's M and M Sports Major Bantam team is competing in the B Division of the tournament, and registered a win and a draw in their opening games Saturday. Their third game was played Monday night.

The Georgetown Johnson and Associates Minor Bantams opened their schedule in the tournament's D Division when they squared off against Richmond Hill.

Today (Wednesday) Johnson and Associates was slated to meet Wex-

ford at 8:30 a.m., and at 6:45 p.m. will take on Tillsonburg.

The top two teams in each of the divisions will advance to the playoffs this Friday.

Since there are only four teams listed in the D Division, the top two teams will square off Friday at 8:30 a.m. for the divisional championship.

Saturday's action will provide the B Division final at 8:30 a.m., while the C Division champion will be decided at 10:15 a.m., and the A Division finalists will square off at noon.

To decide on the grand championship finalists, the B and D Division winners will go against each other at 2 p.m., and the A and C Division winners will play at 4 p.m. The winners there will advance to the grand championship game at 8 p.m.

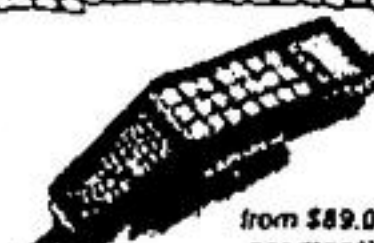
