Acton wins OFSAA title

The Acton High School senior girls' volleyball team captured the OFSAA "A" championship title last week as they went undefeated in six matches at a 16-team tournament hosted by West Elgin High School of West Lorne Thursday and Friday.

The tournament was divided into four pools, with four teams in each. In preliminary action, the Acton squad defeated South Porcupine (15-8, 15-5); West Elgin (15-13, 15-3);

and Clarke High School of Newcastle

(7-15, 15-6, 15-10), to take top spot in their pool.

Acton then met Delhi in quarterfinal action, and after dropping a 15-4 opening game, bounced back to take decisions of 15-9 and 15-6 to earn a berth in the semi-finals. There, Acton faced Ignace and swept two games straight, defeating

their opponents 15-4 and 15-10.

In the tournament final, Acton went up against a strong team from Confederation High School in Val

Caron, and emerged as the champions in what coach Bruce Andrews called a real "nail-biter".

Confederation prevailed in the

opening game of the match, as they took a 15-11 decision. Acton came back in the second to shade Confederation 19-17 in the second game and followed up with a 15-12 victory to claim the champion-

This marked thefirst time Acton High School has won an OFSAA team championship.

The school has been building towards a championship team for the last few years, according to Coach Andrews, and steady improvements have been made along the way.

"Last year was the first time we went to OFSAA," he said. "We played five matches and lost all of them. So it's a credit to the girls for winning this year. They had an excellent tournament."

Andrews had especially high praise for Susan Craig, who is also a member of the Halton-Peel team which plays in the Ontario Volleyball Association. "She was by far the most outstanding player at the tournament," he sald,

Several other players on the Acton team, according to Andrews, "played their hearts out", as well, Acton finished their season in Halton competition with a record of six wins and three losses, after get-

ting off to a samewhat slow start.
