## Group elects new president

Ontario's largest provincial conservation organization has named another avid outdoorsman at its new President.

Jack Craik, 58, of New Liskeard, was elected to a one-year term as President at the Annual Meeting of the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters on February 22, 1987.

A native of Timmins, Craik has been hunting and fishing since he was a teenager. He is an avid canoeer, and enjoys many forms of marksmanship, including trap, skeet, and benchrest shooting. He was a Hunter Safety Instructor for 12 years, and served as President of the Temiskaming Bullseye Club for 3 years.

During the 1970s, Craik was actively involved in conservation education for young people (including the OFAH Junior Conservation School) and in 1974, the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters awarded him the Carling Conservation Trophy as the Ontario sportsman who had done the most for the conservation of fish and wildlife in the preceding year.

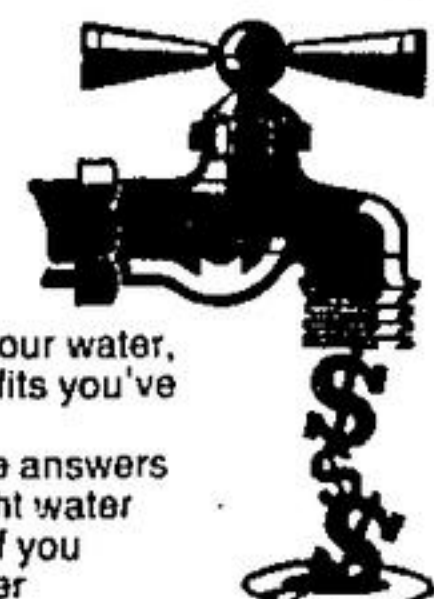
