Johnson bantams split

The Johnson and Associates Bantams were playing a waiting game Thursday afternoon to see if they had earned a berth in the D Division final of the Georgetown International Bantam Hockey Tournament.

Johnson and Associates came out of divisional play with a record of .500, beating Tillsonburg 3-2, tying Richmond Hill 3-3, and losing to Wexford 7-2.

Following action Thursday morning, Richmond Hill had been eliminated from the tournament, after registering two losses and one tie in divisional play.

Wexford had assured themselves of a playoff berth after winning their opening games.

The final divisional game was played late Thursday afternoon, between Wexford and Tillsonburg. With a Wexford victory, Georgetown was assured of a berth in the D Division final scheduled for this morning (Friday).

On the other hand, if Tillsonburg

won or tied, they would get the nod to go on to play for the divisional crown against Wexford.

In their opening game, Johnson and Associates received a goal from Daryl Sproule with just 37 seconds on the clock to earn a tie with Richmond Hill. Sproule had a pair of markers in the match, while Kevin Barrow added a single.

Against Wexford, Dino Lipani and Jeremy Felce accounted for the only Georgetown scoring, as the locals played to a 2-2 tie after the first period, and fell behind 4-2 after the second.

Steve Woolfenden led Wexford with three goals.

Johnson and Associates led 2-0 after the opening frame against Tillsonburg on goals by Jeremy Phillips and Kevin Roe. It was 2-1 after the second, and the teams exchanged goals in the final frame.

Rob Boyle had the other tally for Georgetown, while Michel Rancourt had both goals for Tillsonburg.

Ball registration deadline nears

The Georgetown Baseball Association will conduct its final two formal registration sessions next week.

The sessions will be held at Holy Cross School Tuesday and Thursday evening, 7-9 p.m.

GBA president Hal Ridley says close to 200 players in the rep and house league divisions have signed up so far, and they are expecting to have as many as 150 more before the season gets underway.

The cost to register players is \$45 for T-ball, and \$50 for other categories, as long as they are signed up before the March 28 deadline. After that date, the fees go to \$55 for T-ball and \$60 for the other categories. There is also an additional charge for those players who catch on with rep teams.

"We're encouraging people to register their youngsters before the deadline, because we have a limited number of teams, and we don't want anyone to be left out," Ridley says. "We want to start organizing the teams as soon as possible."

Ridley says a few of the teams have already started informal workouts at local gyms. But he says these are not tryouts, simply a chance for the rep players to get the cobwebs out.

There will be a tyke rep team operating this season, although

Ridley says no coach has been officially named for the team.

The positions of tyke and pee-wee house league conveners are still open, and Ridley says anyone interested in volunteering for the spots should get in touch with the association.

Brian Hannah will be conducting

an umpire's clinic for house league officials in early April, to prepare them for the upcoming season.

Anyone interested in taking part can call Hannah at 877-8113.

The search is continuing for coaches, assistant coaches, and umpires to help out with the upcoming season, but Ridley says, as it stands now, the GBA is in excellent shape.
