Such was the conclusion of this Georgetown youth who returned from India Jan. 21 after a four month trip.

"I feel that I have learned not only a great deal about the country of Indin, its people and history, but about Canada. One really has to be away from this country to truly appreciate the things we take for granted," Mr. Delroy said.



India is a fascinating land that is often dismissed as 'roor' and therefore not significant," Delroy said.

As with any extensive trip, there are many strange stories that accompany the mound of slides and diary pages from the experiences.

For example, more cosmopolitan travellers will comment on the driving habits of Parisians or Romans. but apparently Indian drivers are worse.

"There are no traffic laws in India. At least, if there are, nobody knows about them or follows them. Everyone just uses the horn to say Look out, I'm coming through. Cities end up being a mass of noise from everywhere," Mr. Deircy said.




