 Wexford 2**

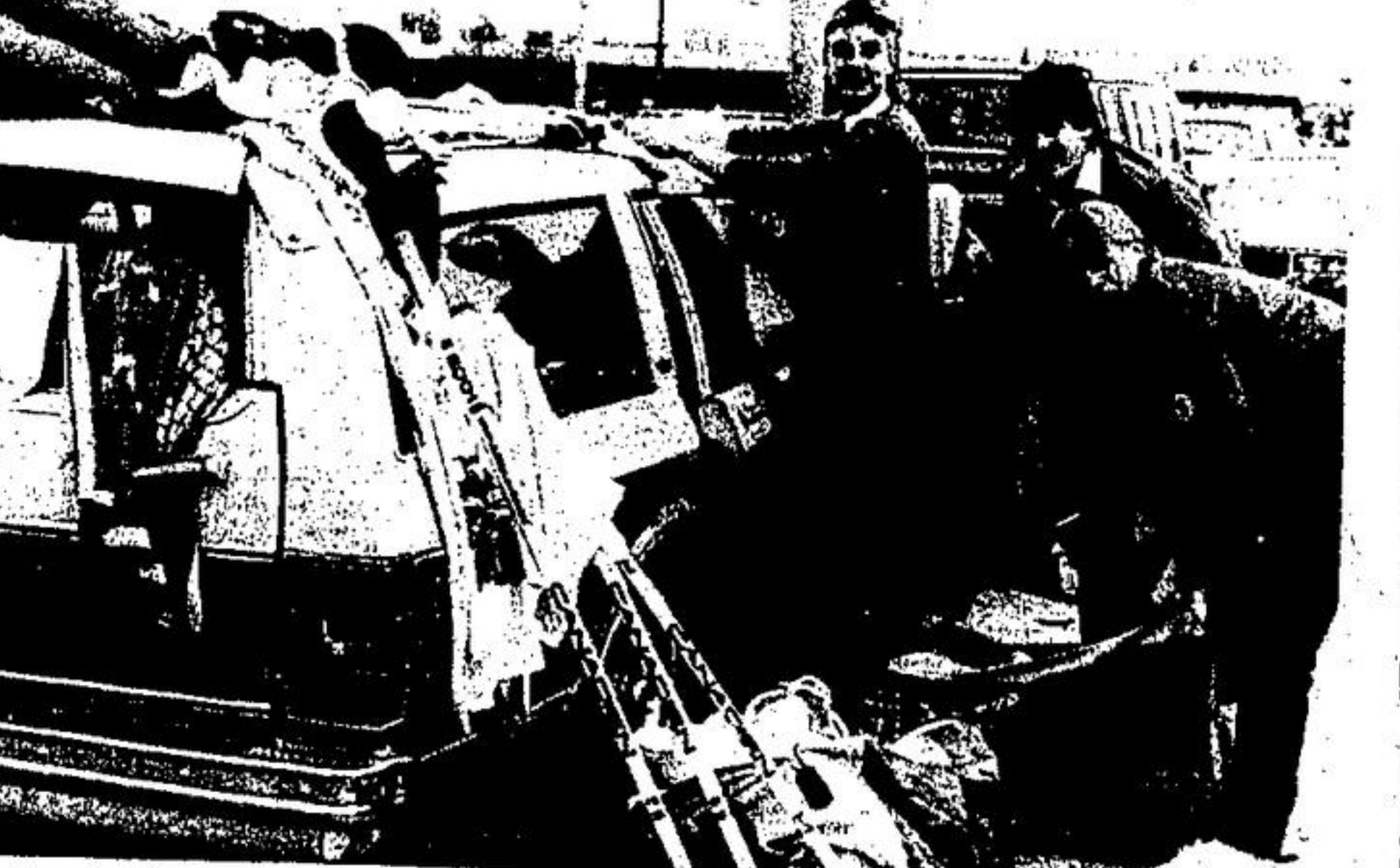
