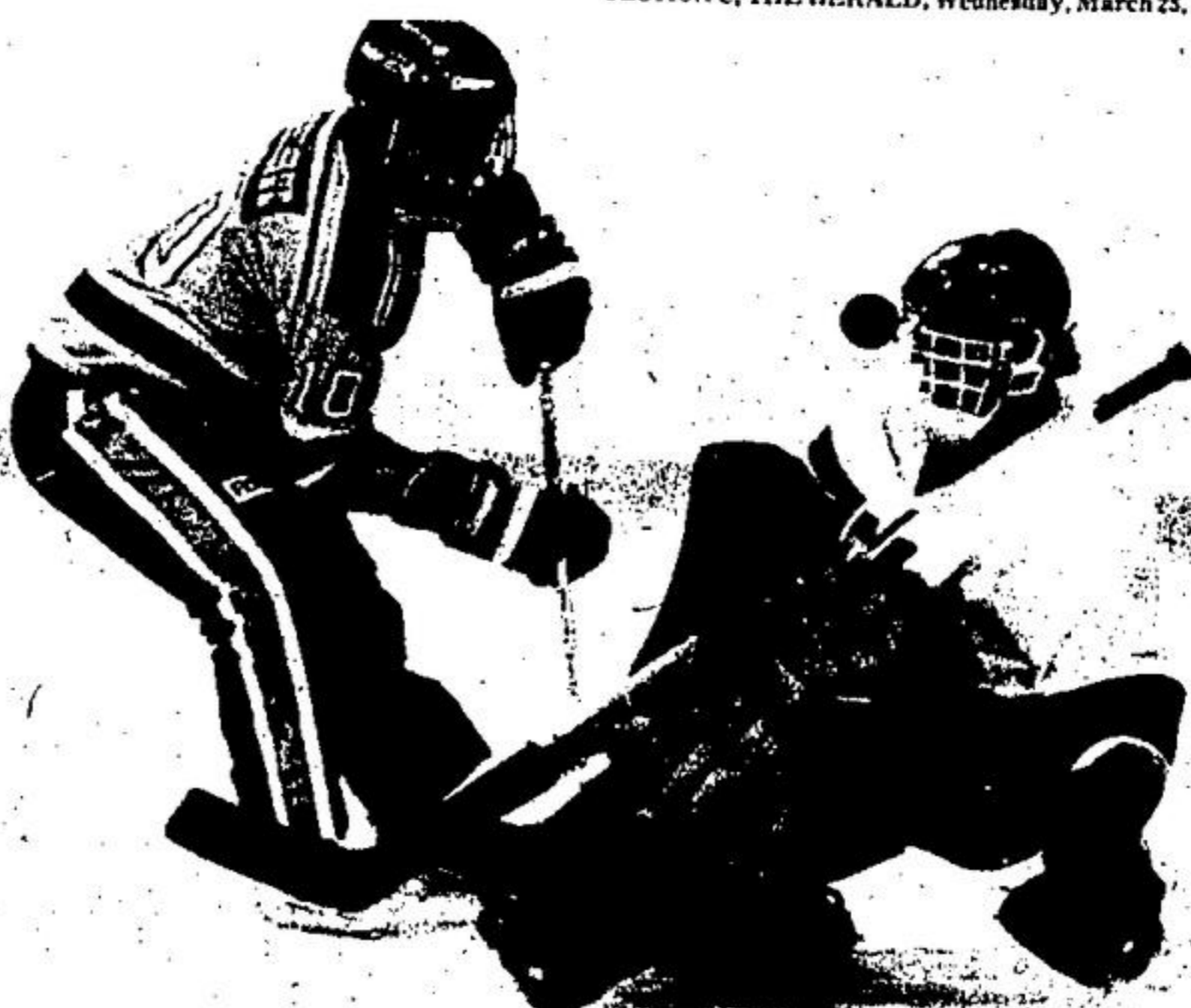




Brooklin-Whitby goalie David Mitchell is congratulated by team mates after they won the tournament's grand championship. (Herald photo)
