Other than that, there weren't any major problems."

If there was one major disappointment in the tournament, it was perhaps the shortfall of community support in people coming out to watch the games.

Friday night, when Georgetown M and M Sports was knocked out of the tournament by Brooklin-Whitby there was naturally a good turnout.

"I was disappointed in the crowds," Pries said Saturday, just prior to the grand championship game. "For the calibre of hockey we had today, there should have been more people here."

But the positives certainly outweighed the negatives in the tournament itself.

Aside from being complimented on the format and organization of the event, there was also high praise for the officials who controlled play on the ice.



"We hate to give up the originals...they've been around for so long." Pries says. "But they really need a facelift. There isn't any room for more plaques on some of them."

For now though, Pries can take a bit of a breather before having to look at getting things organized for Georgetown's 28th Annual International Bantam Hockey Tourna-

ment in 1988. After all, the application for next year's version of the tournament doesn't have to be filed with the governing hockey bodies until April 1 - a week from now.




