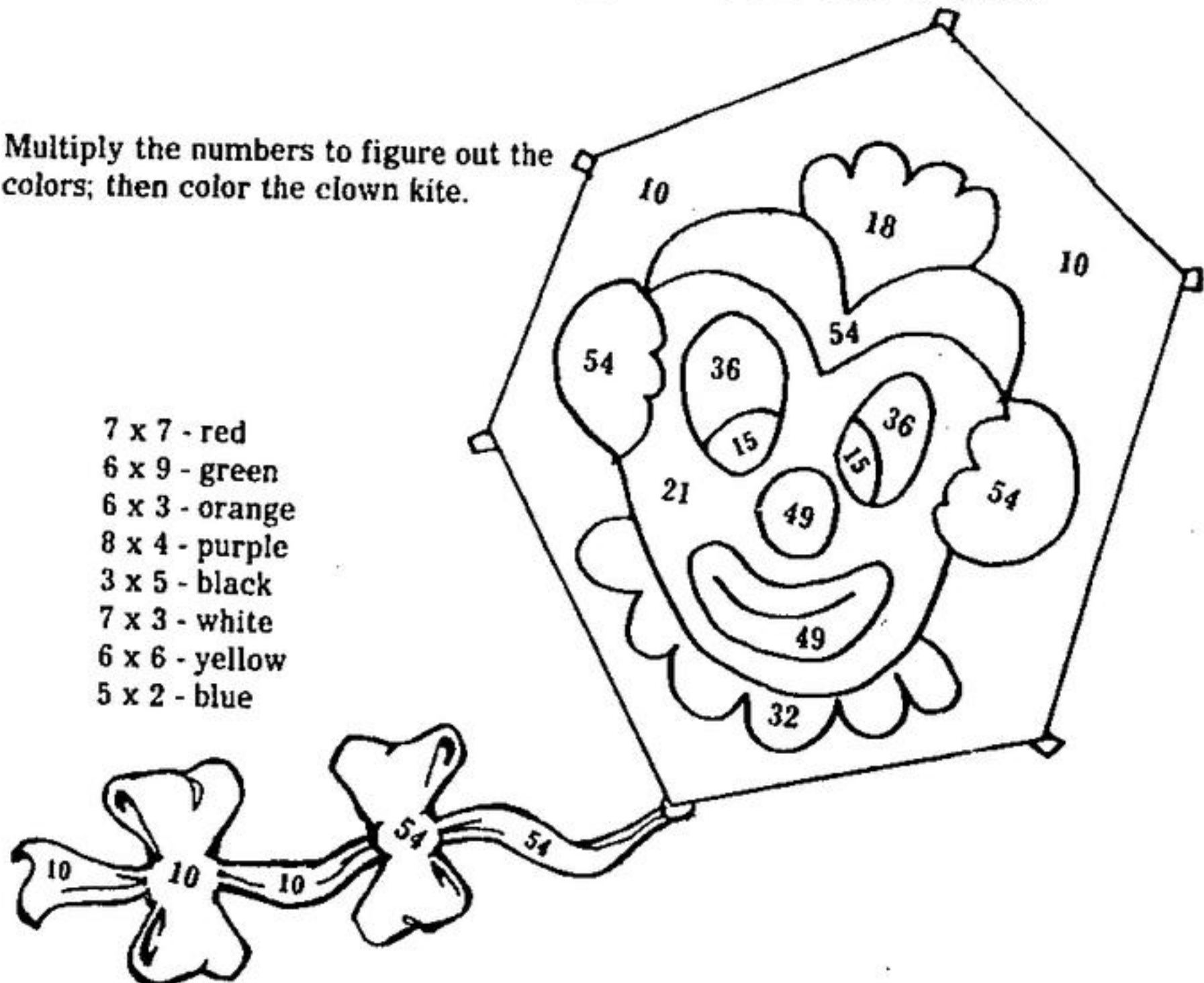

## COLORFUL CLOWN

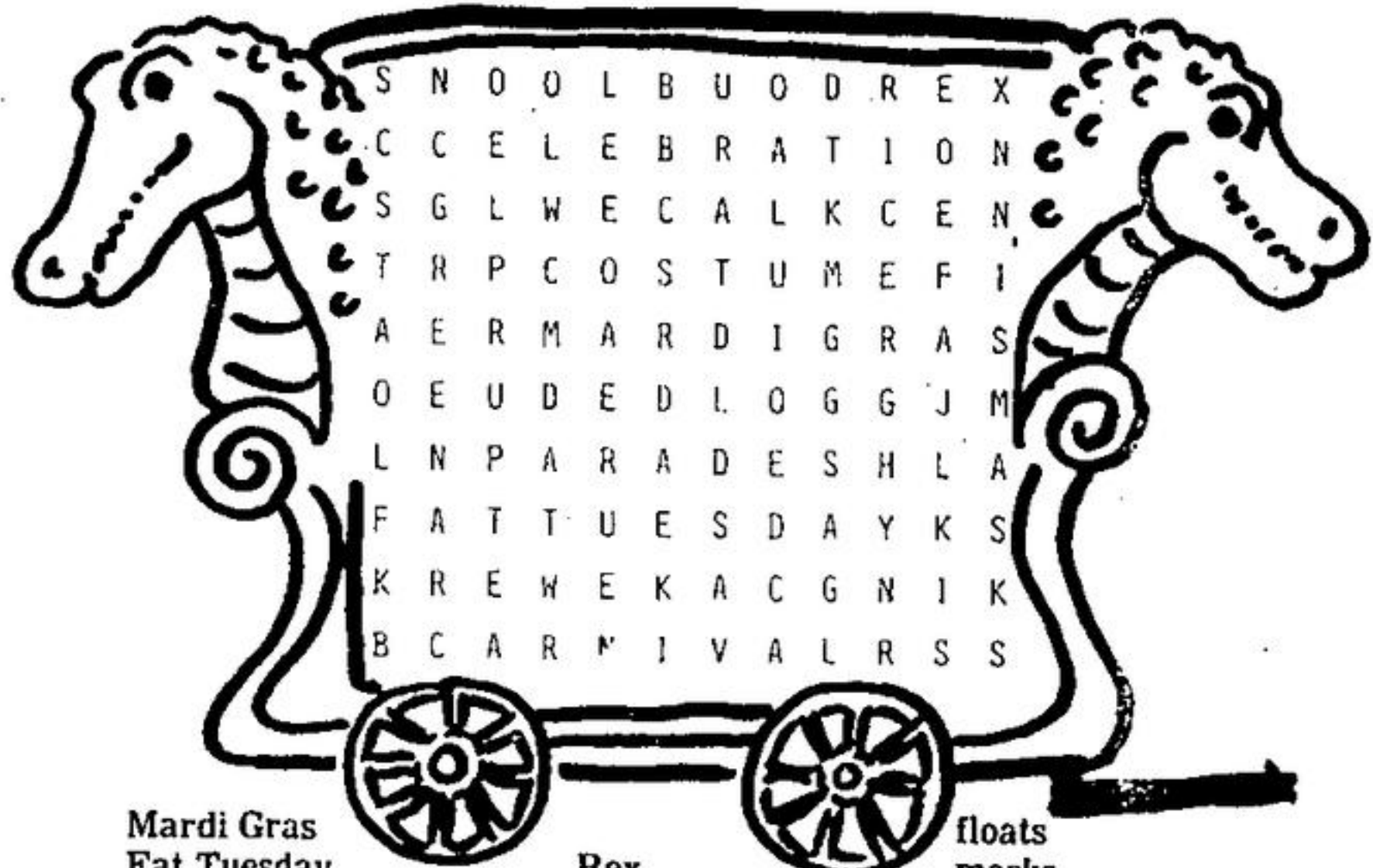
Multiply the numbers to figure out the colors; then color the clown kite.
