## Man stabbed in home by intruder

A Rexway Drive resident suffered multiple stab wounds after he tangled with an intruder in his home early Saturday morning.

Halton Regional Police say Boris DeJonge, 39, of 172 Rexway Dr. was awakened by a male suspect who had entered his bedroom on the second floor of the house. Mr. DeJonge pursued the suspect to the hallway area of the home where there was a struggle. Mr. DeJonge was stabbed several times and the suspect fled the scene on foot, police say.

Mr. DeJonge was taken to Georgetown District Memorial Hospital by ambulance where he is listed in satisfactory condition.

Mr. DeJonge's wife was not injured in the incident. Police report the intruder forced his way into the house through the kitchen window and fled the same way.

Nothing was stolen from the house but damage to a window was estimated at \$50.

Police describe the intruder as white, male, approximately five feet ten inches tall, medium build, with dark hair. He was said to be wearing

a dark sweater at the time. Police are asking anyone with information on the crime to contact them at 878-5511.

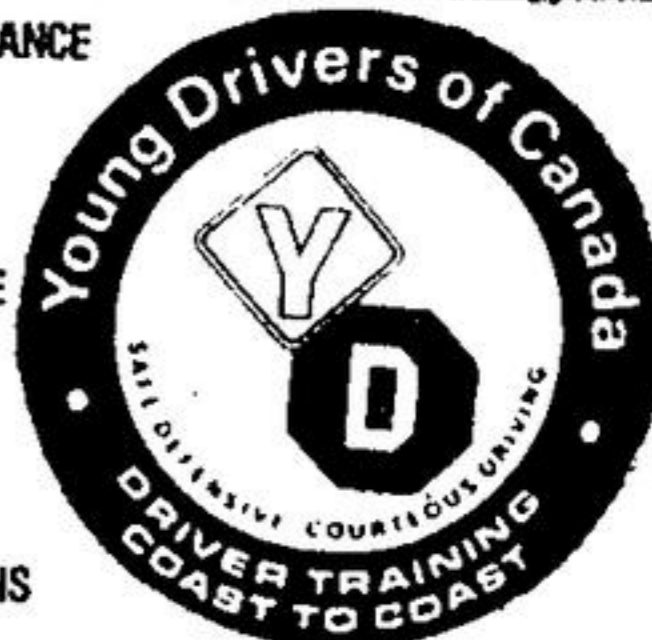

### Police beat

#### Clarification

The Herald wishes to clarify an article which appeared on page 2 of its April 8 edition.

The story noted an accident between two drivers occurred and that a Georgetown woman Christine Burnette was taken to Georgetown District Memorial Hospital.

#### Theft charge

A 27-year-old Georgetown man faces charges of theft under \$1,000 stemming from an incident at O'Tootes Roadhouse on Guelph Street on April 9. At approximately 11:45 p.m. a woman left a wallet containing \$743 in cash sitting on a bar stool. The wallet disappeared and the woman reported the incident to police. The stolen property was recovered. The man will appear in court May 11.

#### Boat radios stolen

AM-FM radios went missing from eight boats stored at the Credit River Boat Company at 16 Adams St. in Norval between April 6-9. Police estimate the stolen radios to be worth a total of \$2,100 while another \$300 damage was caused to a tarp.

#### Durham theft

An intruder entered the Senior Citizens home at 8 Durham St. in Georgetown at 12:05 a.m. April 7 and made off with a television set, a stereo system with cabinet and a cassette deck. Total value of the stolen property is estimated at \$1,850. Police say the intruder entered the home through an unlocked sliding window.

#### Car vandals

Police are investigating a case of vandalism at Capital Ford on Guelph Street between 9 p.m. April 5 and 8 a.m. April 6. A 1984 Dodge van had its wipers broken off, headlights damaged and the front grill smashed in. Damage is estimated at \$300. A 1987 Ford Bronco suffered \$750 damage after the antenna was bent, the chrome mirror was smashed, the driver's door and rear fenders were damaged.

#### Wife punched

A George Street resident faces charges of assault causing bodily harm stemming from an incident at his home April 12. Police say the man punched his wife in the face causing lacerations of the lip and swelling to the cheek bone. The man will appear in court May 11.

#### Car sprayed

Two young offenders entered a house at 97 Raylawn Cr. at 9:25 a.m. April 10 and stole a fire extinguisher. A short time later another house at 47 Raylawn Cr. was entered and someone sprayed the hallway and stairwell with the extinguisher. A car parked at 4 Sims Gate suffered the same fate as the inside of the car was sprayed. No charges have been laid but two males, age 12 and 13 were apprehended.

#### Indecent exposure

Police are investigating a case of indecent exposure at the Georgetown District High School April 10. A man, approximately 20 years old, approached a woman in a vehicle parked behind the high school and exposed himself to her. The woman was waiting for her daughter to come out of the school.

#### Assault charge

Police have laid an assault charge stemming from an incident at 7 Main St. in Georgetown on April 4. A 20-year-old man was charged after a car owner approached him about damage inflicted on his car. Police say the man grabbed the victim, threw him against the building and pulled his hair. The man will appear in court May 25.

#### Motorcycle crash

A 27-year-old Heslop Court resident suffered major injuries when his 750cc Yamaha motorcycle was struck at Rexway Drive and Heslop Court April 11. A 1974 Pontiac, driven by an Irwin Crescent resident was reversing eastbound along Rexway Drive when it struck the northbound motorcycle travelling at roughly the same speed. Zdrauko Bacie, the driver of the motorcycle, is listed in satisfactory condition in Georgetown District Hospital. Police laid a careless driving charge in the incident.

## Region-wide assessment may be next

Going to Region-wide market value assessment may be the next step, now that three out of Halton's four municipalities have embraced the market value assessment when it comes to levying taxes. Only Burlington hasn't made the change.

Regional Chairman Peter Pomeroy noted Haldimand-Norfolk is doing Region-wide market value assessment and would be worth watching.

Although Halton Hills, Milton and Oakville are now on market value assessment, they're not all on the same common base. Regional Treasurer Joe Rinaldo noted. The municipalities are using assessment figures from different years.

Making market value assessment Region wide would mean putting all the municipalities on the same base year. Mr. Rinaldo said two other Regions, Sudbury and the District of Muskoka have also gone with Region-wide market value assessment.

"I'm not going to begin to guess on what the impacts are going to be (on Halton), until you do an impact analysis, you won't know what the impact will be," Mr. Rinaldo said.

#### New co-ordinator

The North Halton Volunteer Bureau, a program of the Social Planning Council, has a new co-ordinator as Patricia Guthro has recently moved to New Brunswick. Replacing her is Dianne Anderson. A resident of Georgetown for the past 13 years, Dianne has a wide range of community experience as a volunteer in the areas of education, recreation, and social service advocacy.

## Man killed, car strikes abutment

A 68-year-old Georgetown man died when his car collided with a bridge abutment at Pearson International Airport April 8.

Peel Regional Police say Raymond Feasy, of Edith Street in Georgetown may have suffered a heart attack before the accident.

Police say Mr. Feasy was driving eastbound on the centre lane at the Arrivals level of Terminal Two shortly before 10 a.m. when his car suddenly accelerated rapidly, then mounted the median and struck the abutment.

Mr. Feasy was pronounced dead at the scene by the Metropolitan Toronto Ambulance Paramedic Unit.

Mr. Feasy was an active member of the Georgetown Palette and Pencil Club and he will be missed by all members, said president Shirley Brambley.

He was on his way to England to visit his relatives there, Ms. Brambley said. A service will be held for Mr. Feasy Wednesday, April 15 at 11 a.m. at the J.S. Jones and Son Funeral Home.
