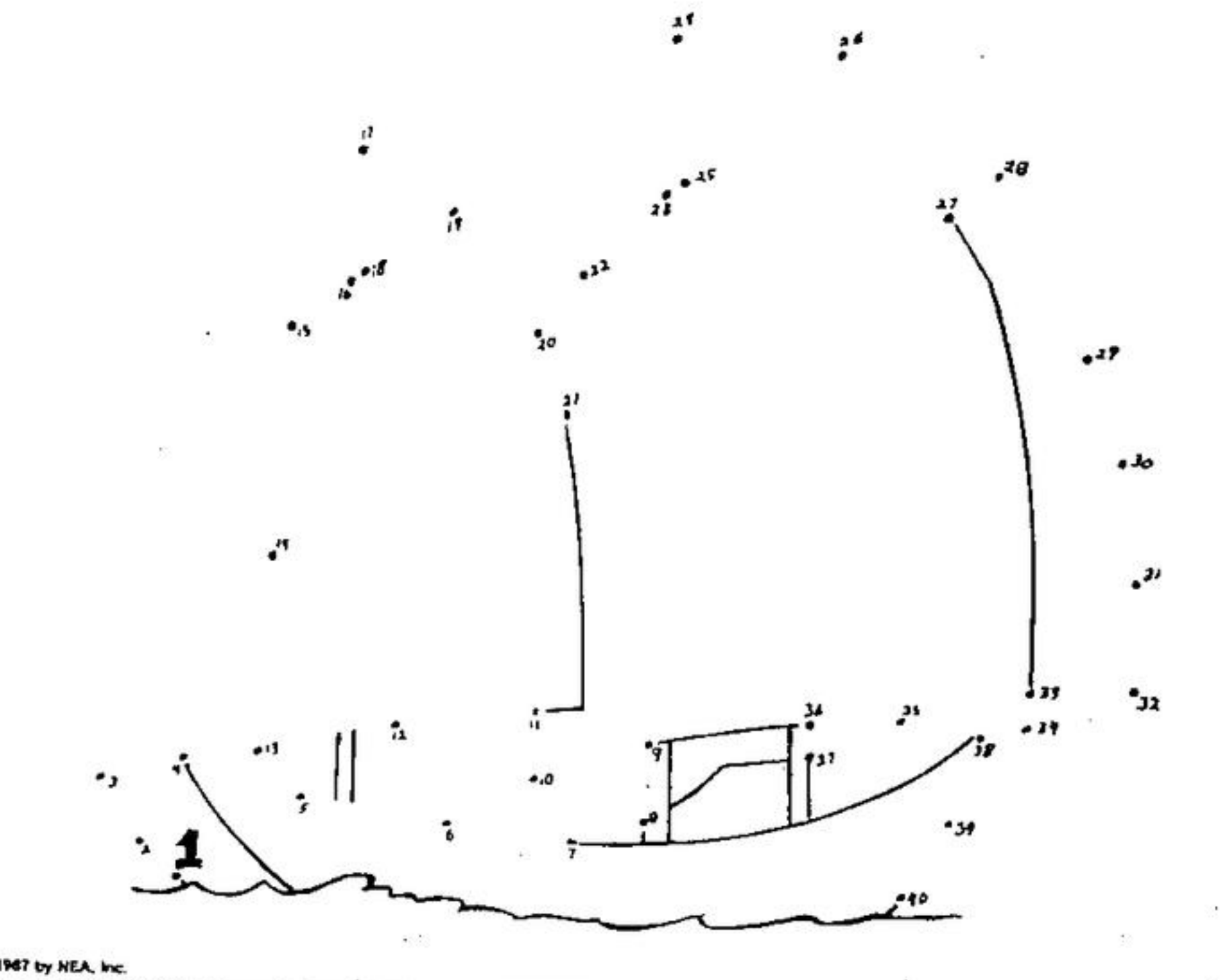

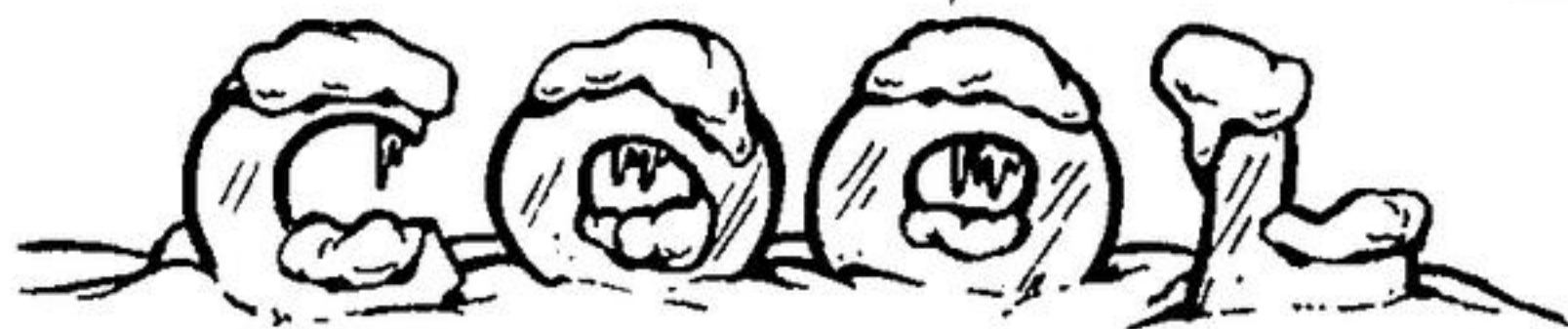

JUNK

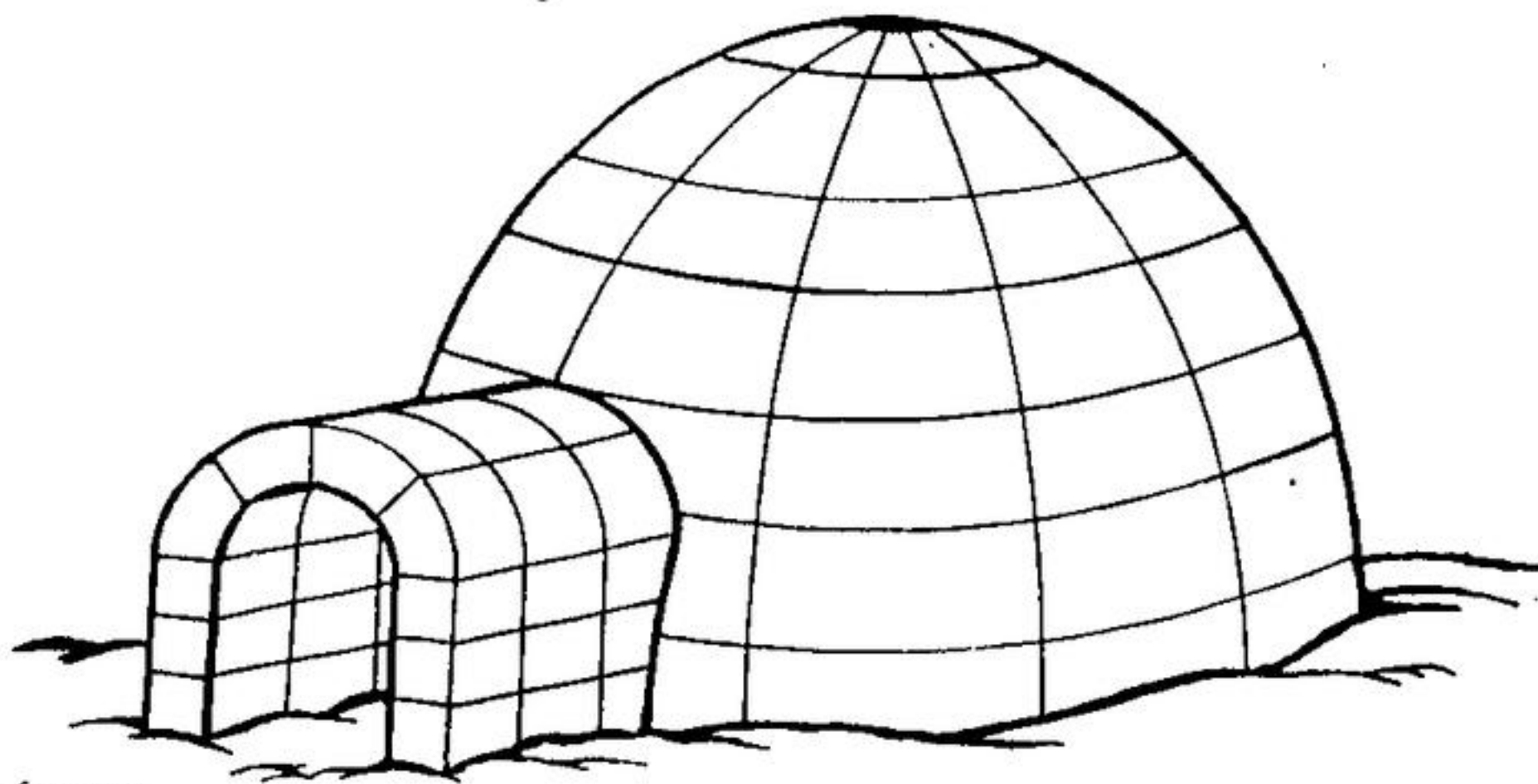

Igloos are built by the central Canadian Eskimos. The entrance tunnel traps cold air. A hole through the top allows a fire to be lit inside. These snowhouses are built from blocks of hard-packed snow. The blocks are 2 to 3 feet long and 1 to 2 feet wide. Study the igloo below; how many blocks, or parts of blocks, can you see? Try counting them first without using a pencil, then check yourself by actually numbering each block.
