Two local volleyball players help team to bronze medal finish

Two local volleyball players filled key roles as the West Side Volleyball Club claimed bronze medals at the Eastern Canadian Midget Cham-

plonships, hosted by St. Jerome, Quebec, April 24-26.

Middle player Phil Rehberg and setter Andreas Schirm are students at Georgetown District High School, and play for the Oakville-based West Side squad.

The midget-aged players (born in 1971-72) are coached by John Burt and Jeff MacIntyre, while Regg Miller is head coach of the entire program, which includes players from all over the Halton-Peel

The Midgets carned the right to advance to the Eastern Canadian finals after finishing second at the provincial championships a month

West Side was one of 12 teams competing in the tournament, and played five matches in a pool of six teams, which was used to determine the medal rounds.

In their first best-of-three match, West Side swept a pair of games from the Selects, Quebec's top team, by scores of 15-4 and 15-12.

After this, they came up against the Astros of Gander, Nfld. and disposed of them 15-8, 15-2.

In their other matches, New Brunswick's second-place team fell to West Side 15-1, 15-1,

With a perfect record of five wins and no losses in the preliminary round, and a margin of 150 points for, and just 48 against. West Side went on to the medal round.

The first game of the match show-ed just how even the two squads were, as West Side found themselves tralling 14-13.

But with three straight points from the middle attack by Rehberg. West Side pulled out a 16-14 decision.

Side's middle attackers in the se-cond game. Rehberg scored three attack block points and five kills in a row to contribute to the win. Burt had high praise for both Rehberg and Schirm.

"Andreas assumed a great leadership role in directing the team. He's an extremely coachable setter," Burt sald.

The coach also describes Hehberg as "reliable and very consistent" and predicts the two quality players will lead quite a "dynasty" in the volleyball program at GDHS in the seasons to come. The bronze medal victory for the

midget squad was one of several successes enjoyed by the West Side club this year. Their juvenile squad collected the bronze medals in the provincial championships and the juniors won the gold.

The concept of club volleyball is a relatively new one, but Burt says it is rapidly catching on.

"To a large extent, the high schools have strongly supported the club concept, which helps strengthen the teams," he says.

As a result of their team's success this ways.

this year, Burt and MacIntyre have been chosen coaches of a regional team, which will take in players from the Halton Region across to Windsor. The team, comprised of players born after 1969, will compete at the Summer Games, after which selections will be made for a provincial team. cial team.

"Phil and Andreas are both strong candidates to make the regional team," Burt says, "And personally, I see Phit as having the qualities for the provincial team.

Burt's comments were supported by the fact that Rehberg was one of six all-stars selected at the Eastern Canadian championships in Quebec. Next year, Burt says West Side

will have to restock its midget program entirely. He also added there is consideration being given to splitting the Halton-Peel Region into north and south divisions, thereby giving more

players the opportunity to compete. Should this happen, Brampton, Georgetown, and Acton will be grouped together for the northern
