

Rebel rugby teams split doubleheader with White Oaks

The Georgetown District High School senior and junior rugby teams will both face stiff tests this week when they tangle with Oakville Trafalgar and Acton Redmen teams in the East Halton conference.

In action last week, the Rebel squads split a doubleheader on home turf against White Oaks. The senior Rebels won their game by an 18-7 margin, but the juniors suffered a 14-4 setback.

Bill Bingham, coach of both squads, said the seniors were able to take advantage of several tactical errors by the White Oaks team. "They had quite a few football players who didn't quite know what to do at certain times," he said. "They were winning the scrums at the beginning but became tired, and we took over."

John Watts, Jamie Spiller, and Dave Barrow all had tries for the Rebels, and Spiller was successful in converting all three.

In the junior fixture, the White Oaks pack proved stronger than Georgetown's.

"We just got too far behind," Bingham said. "And then we had several penalties inside our 25-yard line."

Jason Dodokin had the lone try for the Rebels.

Both Rebel teams were back in action yesterday (Tuesday) as they travelled to Oakville to meet Trafalgar.

Bingham considers this to be the toughest stretch of the schedule, having to face strong opponents in Trafalgar, and then Acton this Thursday.

In exhibition outings against Acton this year, the juniors managed a tie with the Redmen, while the seniors lost by a mere penalty kick. The games Thursday at the GDHS playing field begin at 3 p.m.

NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS IN THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS

THE ONTARIO WEED CONTROL ACT AS IT APPLIES TO PERSONS IN POSSESSION OF LAND WITHIN THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS

Unless noxious weeds are destroyed by May 25th, 1987, and as often as necessary throughout the season to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollens, the Town of Halton Hills may enter private property and destroy these weeds. The costs will be charged against the property owners and collected in the manner of municipal taxes.

Goatsbeard, thistles, chicory, poison ivy, ragweed, wild carrot, and milkweed are among the weeds considered noxious, and must be destroyed wherever found. Complaints regarding dandelion and golden rod will not be accepted as these are not considered noxious under the terms of The Weed Control Act.

Anonymous complaints will not be accepted.
