#### New teaching device

A new teaching device which will help people better understand the rescue technique of artificial respiration was unveiled in Burlington yesterday, as part of the Lifeline '87 Conference, running through the weekend.


The new device, known as the Actar, is considerably different from conventional mannequins that have

been used in life saving courses. Actor has a hollow plastic head, and an exposed respiratory system which shows students how the lung inflates and deflates. The lungs are interchangeable, so by interchanging the apparatus, students can simulate applying artificial respiration to an infant.

The Actor was designed by three Canadian industrial designers, and is to be marketed by the Royal Life Saving Society in Ontario.


