## Firestone Jrs. show confidence in 3-2 win over Maryhill

Trevor Riebot's double with two out in the bottom of the eighth inning provided a slim margin of victory for the Halton Hills Firestone Juniors as they edged Maryhill 3-2 in Ontario Junior Fastball League play Sunday in Acton.

The win leaves the Firestone squad unbeaten in two starts this season after they whipped Shakespeare 21-6 in their home opener the previous week.

The game proved to be a defensive duel throughout, according to Halton Hills' assistant coach Dave Willett.

Even though the team is still in the early going of their 1987 campaign, the players have been showing the confidence they will need to keep winning.

Part of that confidence comes from being able to rely on their pitchers, Willett says.

John Hammer started the game on the mound for Halton, and was replaced by David Haynes in the sixth inning.

Many of the Firestone players

have been working defensively behind Hammer for several years, through several age categories, and Willett says they know what to expect when he is throwing in a game.

Haynes is just in his second season with the squad, but the rest of the team is becoming more comfortable with him on the mound, Willett says.

"The way he's throwing now, all the players have confidence in David," Willett says. "They're there to back him up, and they have to have the confidence in their pitcher, themselves."

Halton Hills opened the scoring in Sunday's outing after a single by Bobby Anderson in the bottom of the second inning. Riebot came through with a single to knock Anderson in, giving Firestone a 1-0 lead.

Maryhill fought back in their half of the sixth, and followed up a walk with a home run off a Haynes' drop ball that didn't do what it was supposed to do, making it 2-1.

But in the bottom of the sixth,

Steve Wilson reached on an error, and scored on Anderson's RBI single to tie the game at two.

This set the stage for Riebot's heroics in the eighth.

With two out, Anderson took a walk, and crossed the plate with the winning run when Riebot stroked a double.

Anderson finished the game two for three at the plate, scoring twice, and batting in the other Halton Hills run.

Riebot was two for four, with two RBIs, while Al Scott came through with two hits in three trips to the plate, including a triple.

In all, Halton Hills had nine hits.

In the pitching department, Hammer worked the first five innings. He allowed three hits, issued one walk, and struck out six Maryhill batters.

In completing the game, Haynes gave up two hits, walked three, and also had six strikeouts.

The Firestone Juniors will play a return match in Maryhill this Thursday night.

Their next home game will be Tuesday when they host Fergus at the Glen Williams ball park, beginning at 8 p.m.

## Disabled games planned

Regional Games for the Physically Disabled will be held in three Ontario cities this spring with the help of a \$45,000 grant, John Enkhis, Ontario Minister of Tourism and Recreation announced recently.

The grant, which was awarded to The Games Council for the Physically Disabled, will assist the three municipalities to operate the Games for competitors from Wheelchair, Blind, Amputee and Cerebral Palsy Sports Associations.

The Eastern Regional Games will be held in Cornwall, May 29-31 and

the Central Regional Games will take place in St. Catharines, May 22-23. As there were no Northern Ontario cities able to host the games, the combined Southwestern, Northwestern and Northeastern Regional Games will be hosted by the City of Windsor June 6-7.

All three events are being organized by local organizing committees with administrative assistance from the Games Council for the Physically Disabled, and the Sports Office for the Disabled at the Ontario Sports Centre in Willowdale, Ontario.
