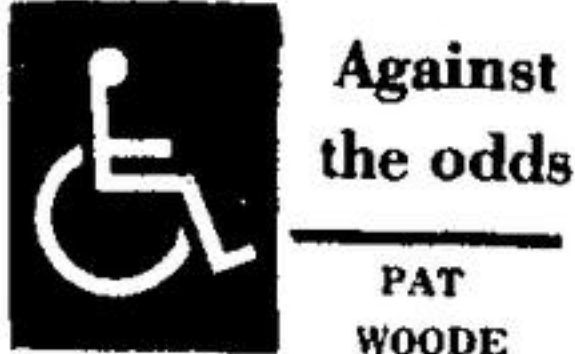

Drury High School was organized by the Physically Handicapped Citizens Association (PHCA) to promote awareness about the abilities of Disabled Persons and generate funds to support this non-profit organization. In both regards it was successful but even more important it has become the catalyst for new wheelchair sports association in Halton and Milton. Halton Wheelchair Athletes are now a reality thanks to the efforts of Sonny Domato of the Tyson Health Care Centre, Milton, and Mike Leworthy, the teams coach. Plans are underway for a wheelchair Marathon in Milton on July 25/87 in order to raise needed funds to obtain equipment (namely wheelchairs) for the young players who look forward to seeing action in the fall. Uniforms have been donated by ESM Sports of Milton.
