The Ontario Provincial Police are pleased to report that the number of traffic deaths during the holiday Victoria Day weekend dropped substantially when compared to 1986 and as well the number of boating deaths plummeted from seven in 1966 to one this year.

Six persons were killed in traffic accidents on roadways patrolled by the provincial police this year as compared to nine in 1986.

"This is a significant reduction in holiday traffic fatalities," said Deputy Commissioner Bob Rose. "We attribute this decline to an increased public awareness of safety on the road and waterways of Ontario and to increased enforcement by our officers of the holiday weekend. In 1985, prior to Strict Is Fair there were 18 traffic fatalities during the three-day Victoria Day

Coping with sport injuries

With the season for outdoor sports and activities approaching, we can expect to see an increase in alips, falls and other mishaps which can lead to painful and inconvenient sprains.

Even if many of us try to function in spite of them, sprains can lead to chronic weakness of a joint or even permanent reduction of mobility if not treated properly. Sprains are a partial stretching or tearing of a ligament anywhere in the body. Ankles and wrists are the most likely joints to be affected, but it's also possible to sprain a toe, knee, shoulder or even a rib.

"Whiplash" is a strain of the neck ligaments and the most common

type of back strain is caused by lifting heavy objects improperly.

Sprains, for the most part, are preventable. It's easy, for example, to be aware of and avoid the hazards of sports such as snow or water skiling, women's shoes which are fashionable but provide little support, and dimly-lit or toy-littered stairs at home. Elderly persons should take special care when faced with gravel or sand-covered sidewalks and roads. during the spring.

If you do receive a sprain, get prompt medical attention and follow your doctor's advice about treatment and rest. Your pharmacist can help if you have any questions about medication your doctor may prescribe. He or she can also give advice should you need tensor or support bandages.

Even though a strain isn't as bad as a broken bone, you should treat it the same way. Make sure the injured ligament is rested and given enough time to heal. As long as a ligament hurts it shouldn't be forced to bear its normal load. If you try to come back too soon from a sprain, it could turn into a chronically painful condition


