**DOGS** - Dogs make good pets and many people enjoy them, however, it seems that many dog owners con-

sider it their right to allow their pets to defoul public areas. According to park By-law 76-40, dog owners are required to clean up dog excrement and to control their dog in public parks. Persons can be fined for not adhering to the park By-law. Please help to make our parks more enjoyable places to be by cleaning up after pets.

We hope that all users of the parks and natural lands will respect the delicate balance of plant and soil life and will leave all areas in a condition which will allow other people to enjoy them also.
