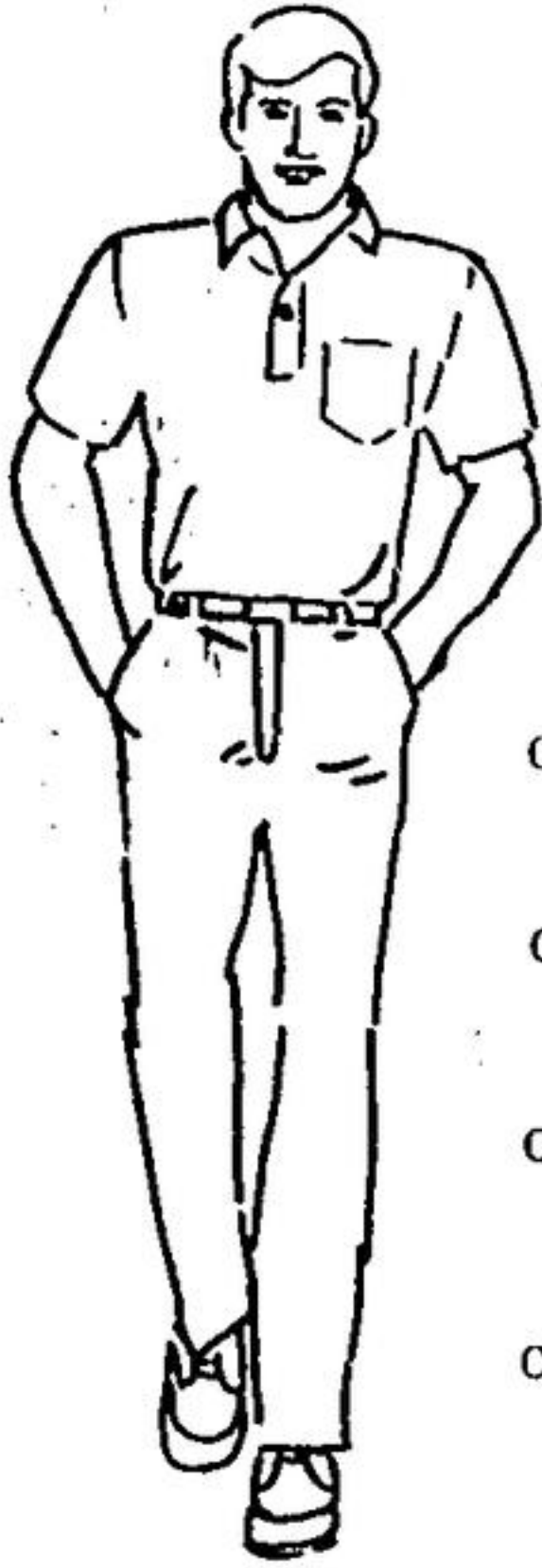

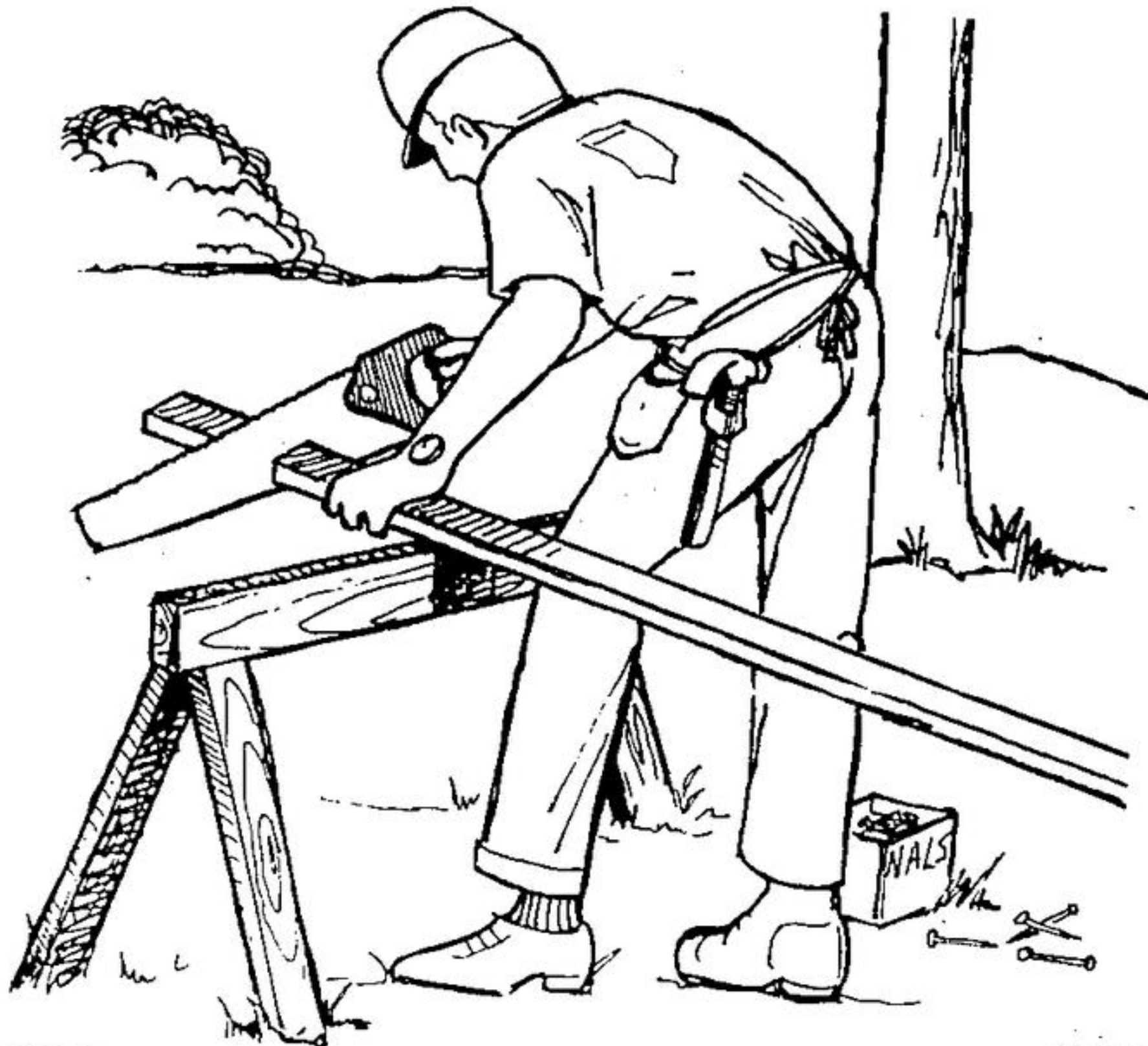

Mistakes Mistakes

In his spare time, this dad is learning to be a carpenter. There are eleven mistakes in this picture though. Can you help this dad by circling each one you find?



Answers: a pocket on the back of the shirt; the teeth of the saw on the wrong side; the sawn off portion of the board still hanging in the air; three fingers on the man's left hand; not real "claw" on the hammer; one leg missing from the sawhorse; one pants leg is curled; the other isn't; a boot on one foot, a shoe on the other; nails suspended; one of the nails has two heads.



- The most influential promoter of Father's Day was Mrs. John Bruce Dodd of Spokane, Washington. Her own father, William Smart, had raised six children alone after his wife died at an early age.
- These U.S. Presidents and their First Ladies had the largest number of children: John Tyler-16, William Henry Harrison-10, and Rutherford Hayes-8.

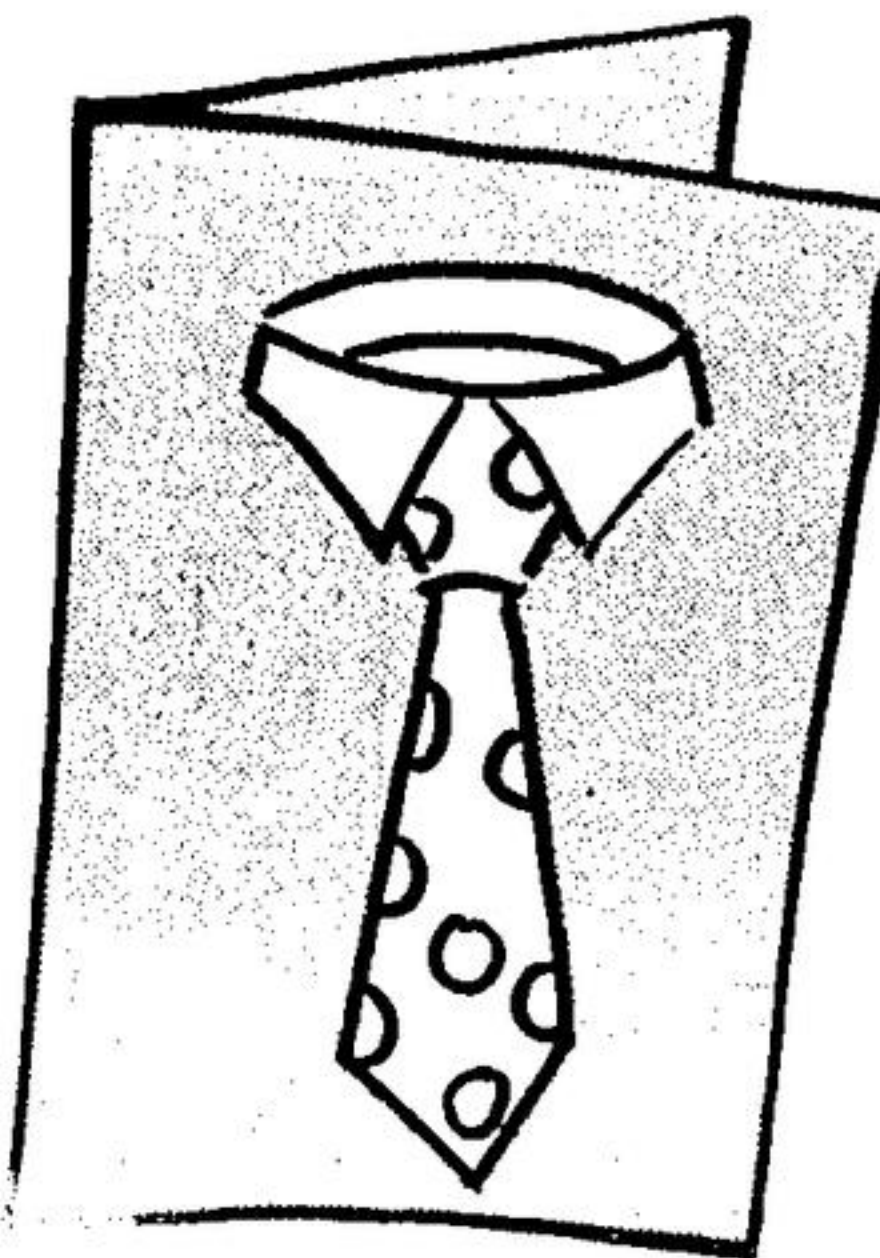
Ramona and Her Father by Beverly Cleary. Grs. 3-4. Ramona's dad loses his job and Ramona tries to help.
