I certainly agree with her husband that she is by no means a "part time doctor". I do however disagree with the statement that: "She is the only doctor specializing in OBgynnecology in Georgetown". Dr. Ford is here, has the exact qualifications (M.R.C.O.G.) as Dr. Kumar and he is willing to work and take some of the load off Dr. Kumar's shoulders. However the Hospital Board, in their infinite wisdom, has decided that Dr. Ford shall not

To me it is clear that there can only be two reasons for the rumour of "part time doctor". The first reason is that Dr. Kumar has no home base with her own phone number. People do not think the emergency room at the hospital is the ideal place for a private consultation with your obstetrician. The second reason may

Doctor is working many long hours

In reply to Dr. Kumar's husband's

letter, I would like to say that not for one moment has anyone questioned Dr. Valerie Kumar's credentials. I have no doubt that she is most eminently qualified, as she holds exactly the same credentials as Dr. I might add that an M.R.S.O.G. is

not recognized in this Province as a specialty-only a Fellowship is. Both Drs. Ford and Kumar are family physicians restricting their prac-tices to Obstetrics and Gynecologyeven though their qualifications are recognized elsewhere in the Commonwealth. Neither one holds a Fellowship.

The question here is "who is our physician of choice?" Many women prefer a female gynecologist and others will stand by Dr. Kumar exactly as Dr. Ford's patients stand by him. Only time will tell if we have been unjustly robbed of our physi-cian of choice-and there are some who think we will never know if, in fact, a case has been deliberately built up over the years.

No one is questioning Dr. Kumarwe certainly haven't heard from Mrs. Ford.


Lillias Bowman wanted to know. The town's assistant clerk Stephen Thomson said there would be nothing to fall back on, other than the agreement between the town and




