The 260 acre Acton quarry is the subject of a proposal by United Aggregates and Cement Waste Management Systems to turn it into a garbage dump. Local residents have organized to form a group (POWER) to oppose the dump site but Cement's parent company, Shieldings Incorporated, has completed extensive studies on the quarry proposal. They hope to remove all the limestone from the floor of the quarry before converting it to a dump, that reduces the likelihood of requiring a lining, says a Shieldings spokesman. (Herald photo)

Quarry glossary confusing

It wasn't much help, but town councillors received more information on the proposed landfill in Acton. Administrator-clerk Joe Simon said the six page glossary of technical terms was dropped off by Reclamation Systems Inc. Their staff realized some of the

vocabulary used last week in a presentation to town councillors was highly technical. "I want definitions of the definitions they've given me," complained a laughing Coun. Pam Johnston. Some of the definitions are just as difficult to understand, for example, "Amabel Formation" is

defined as "a geologic of porous dolostone characterized by porous reefal voids". Shieldings Incorporated wants to develop a 260 acre site on United Aggregates Ltd. quarry lands into a dump. They have hired Reclamation Systems to study the feasibility of it.
