## Father's Day origins: It started with a Civil War yeteran widower

This year June 21st will mean more than just the first day of summer. It's also Father's Day - one of the most popular of Canada's "unof-ficial celebrations". On the third Sunday in June, dads of all ages will be celebrated, praised and generally acknowledged for their contribution tofamily tife.

According to Alleen Murray, to-day's dads are being recognized for many of the same qualities that lead to the observation of Father's Day 77

"Fathers are taking on more and more of the family roles traditionally assumed by mothers, whether it's helping out with household chores or sharing childcare responsibilities," she says. "For many fathers, their family rather than their job has become the primary source of emotional fulfillment."

Washington, Mrs. Dodd had suggested it be held on June 5th, her own father's birthday, but it was postponed until the third Sunday in June to allow the Spokane ministers time to prepare special sermons. The celebration received wide press coverage and the idea of Father's Day spread across the country. Soon a national movement was formed to have Father's Day proclaimed a na-

tional holiday.

—Surprisingly, it was not until 1972 that the U.S. passed a congressional resolution permanently establishing Father's Day as a national holiday. In Canada it continues to retain its status as an "unofficial" holiday.

-Today, Father's Day is celebrated

in more than 40 countries around the world. Approximately 18 million Father's Day cards are exchanged in Canada and the vast majority are delivered personally with a "hug and a kiss".
