Kept moist, in the sun and aerated, enzyme producers break down debris, freeing nutrients to feed compost dwellers and future plant life. Thus: new life from old.

Dear John, Thank you for the continuing correspondence. My letter to you was not a protest against the US, but against the arms race in general and against Canadian cruise missile testing in particular. For the record, I have written more letters of pro-test to the Soviets (many about human rights abuse) than to the White House. My main point was that we can best support our US ally by pressuring them to change their military policy, just as our govern-ment is already doing, for example, with regard to Central America.

The Soviets have already "unilaterally" ceased testing of nuclear weapons for 19 months. Canada could increase the present momentum towards arms reduction by a moratorium on testing here.

In the minute you have taken to read this, the world has spent over \$2 million on weapons, and 30 children have died of hunger and disease. The arms race is wasteful, unnecessary, and wrong, and all participants in it deserve unrelenting pressure to end it. I will gladly heap praise upon them when the first of over 50,000 nuclear weapons is dismantled!

# Study on Milton's growth coming

The study of Milton's growth potential is on its way. Last week's planning and public works committee members approved a consortium of consulting firms

to undertake the first phase of the three phase project. The consortium consists of IBI Group, R.V. Anderson Associates Ltd., Simcoe Engineering Ltd., and

Creative Research Group.
Formally called the Halton Urban Structure Review Process, the first phase of the study is budgeted at \$185,000. Milton Council is to provide \$60,000 as its share.

Ministry of Municipal Affairs funding is being sought for the study Burlington Coun. Joan Little said she felt "uncomfortable" about the consultant selection, as the public may perceive a conflict in it.
