Poster celebrates milestone

One hundred years of Canadian wildlife conservation is being celebrated by Ontario sportsmen with a commemorative poster they are distributing across the nation.

Featuring a Michael Dumas watercolour of a peregrine falcon and three nestlings, the poster has been produced by the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters (OFAH) to focus attention on endangered species, and to honour the centenary of North America's oldest wildlife sanctuary, Last Mountain Lake in Saskatchewan. This sanctuary has provided excellent wildlife viewing and hunting opportunities since 1887.

The OFAH is distributing the 25" by 30" poster to fish and game associations, conservation groups, and naturalists clubs throughout Canada. The poster is also available by mail or phone order directly from the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters.
