Each team will play three games during the day, and the proceeds from registration and contributions from players and visitors will be accepted for CHAMP.

Among the organizations that have already indicated they will take part by sending a representative are Sons of Scotland Benevolent Society, British Club, and the Royal Canadian Legion.

A lunch will be provided for the participants by the women's section of the club, and trophes will be presented to members of the top team, while the consolation winners will also receive an award.
