Sabatini confirms entry at Player's Challenge Tennis

Argentina's Gabriela Sabatini, the eighth-ranked player in the world and semi-finalist at the 1987 French Open, has confirmed her entry in the \$390,000 Player's Challenge Tennis Championships at the National Tennis Centre at York University August 15-23.

Sabatini, who teamed with Zina Garrison of the United States to capture the doubles title at last year's Player's Challenge in Montreal, will join defending champion Helena Sukova, 1986 runner-up Pam Shriver, third-ranked Chris Evert

and reigning Australian Open champion Hana Mandikova as top 10 players confirmed to the Player's

She has risen to number eight in the world based on some excellent results in 1987, including a victory over Martina Navratilova in the semi-finals of the Italian Open In May. She says she's anxious to

return to Canada. Sabatani, 17, has built an impressive record with singles titles at the 1985 Japan Open and 1986 Argentine Open and Grand Slam semifinal appearances at the French Open in 1985 and 1987 and Wimbledon in 1986.

The 5'8", 130-pound native of Buenos Alres, Argentina, has used her devastating backhand to post some outstanding doubles results with 1986 wins at the Player's Challenge with Garrison and European Indoors with Graf. She also teamed with Graf to finish as runners-up at the 1986 and 1987 French Open and they were semifinalists in the 1986 U.S. Open doubles draw.

The Player's Challenge, which is considered the major championship between Wimbledon and the U.S. Open, is organized by Tennis Canada and sponsored by Player's.




