Longhorns spike football Greeks

G.F.F.L. REPORT
 In GFFL play last Sunday, the Longhorns, under the direction of new QB Paul Allison beat the Greeks to move into sole possession of second place. In other games, Corrigan Instrument blasted Peel County Bandits 34-13, Mand M Pro Sports and North Halton Sports tied 27-27 and Karry Kitchens topped Norval 28-10.

Longhorns Vs. Greeks
 The injury several weeks ago to Longhorn QB Zeke McCandless left a gaping hole in the herd offence. That void has now been impressively filled by Paul Allison who led the Longhorns to victory over the Greeks on Sunday and not only did Allison star in the QB position, he also shone on defence, intercepting a pair of Greek passes.

Herd touchdowns were scored by Mark Hamilton, Jim Lindsay and Wayne Densmore with two. Hamilton also scored a two point convert.
 The Greeks, who saw their visions of second place quashed, scored as many touchdowns as the Longhorns, but fell short on the converts. The cattle stopped them on 3 of 4 two point convert attempts.

Doug Getty, a Smoker turned Greek, began playing football when most of his team-mates were still in diapers. Now in the twilight of his illustrious career, Getty showed that he still had some football savvy by scoring a pair of TDs. Terry Hunt and Frank Medinski scored the other Greek majors and Mike Miehm contributed a two point convert. Steve Frost, another Smoker survivor, picked off a Longhorn pass.

Corrigan Instrument Vs Peel County Bandits
 The demons that haunted Corrigan Instrument early in the 1987 season appear to have been thoroughly exorcised. Coming off an impressive victory over the Queens two weeks ago, Corrigan crushed the hapless Bandits this week with a seven touchdown scoring frenzy.

Brent Ferguson alone, doubled the Bandit scoring production. Paul Larose directed four touchdown passes his way and threw him a two point convert for good measure. Other Instrument TD scorers were Brian King and Hugo Duffach with a pair. John Larose grabbed three two point converts. Kevin Harrison playing on a badly damaged foot, and evoking memories of the great Bobby Baum who skated in a playoff game with a broken leg, scored another two point convert.

For Peel County, the only bright light was West Samis' two touchdowns. An infusion of new talent in the off-season will be necessary to bring the Bandits into contention again.

M and M Pro Sports Vs North Halton Sports
 M and M Pro Sports now seldom produce the excitement they were renowned for in their former incarnations as Wimpeys and Delrex Tavern. Once a GFFL power, they now struggle to hold themselves above the league's lower echelons. On Sunday, a bit of the old magic returned, as they fought back to tie North Halton on the final play of the game.

It appeared through the first three quarters and most of the fourth, that North Halton's consistency would carry the day for them. They scored a TD in each quarter and hit on three of four converts. North majors were scored by Mike Buck, Mark Waters and Chris Peavoy with two defensive specialists Kevin Brown and Bill Fournier stymied the Pro Sport attack with interceptions.

For the Pro Sports, 1986 MVP Mike Henderson scored a pair of TDs, with Grant Nairn and Marcus Noell contributing one apiece. Nairn's TD was on the final play of the game. QB Bob Dean launched a 30 yard strike into an agitated assembly of Pro Sport and North Halton players. Several touched the pigskin before Nairn pulled it in. On the subsequent convert Marcus Noell assured the tie with a clutch
