Spouse in the house rule altered

For years people have been sharing accommodation and claiming social assistance only to be told that either the "tenant" must go or no assistance would be forthcoming."The Spouse in the House" rule has now been radically altered. The new regulations state that the cohabitant is not a "spouse" until there is a legal obligation for support. This means that a mother on Mother's allowance may collect payments and still have male occupant living in the house.

The provincial government in its recent budget has given a \$50 increase to those receiving GAINS-D. This includes persons who are living alone or with a family. People in group homes or institutions will receive an additional \$23 dollars per month confort allowance. Seniors in institutions will continue to receive \$112 per month, and those under 65 will receive \$100 per month. The institution per diem rate is not directly affected as it is indexed to inflation.

By the end of 1987 the gap between seniors and GAINS-D recipients will be \$286 per month.






