## Karry Kitchens clouts Corrigan

In Georgetown Flag Football League action last Sunday, Karry Kitchens, playing their best game of 1987, upset Corrigan Instrument 37-29 and the Longhorns toppled North Halton 36-12. In other games the Greeks beat Norval 28-7 and an unusually anemic Dairy Queen offence struggled to a 23-12 victory over the lowly Peel County Bandits.

**Corrigan Instrument vs. Karry Kitchens**  
Corrigan players must wonder how they can play well enough one week to beat Dairy Queen and then lose a few weeks later to Karry Kitchens. But perhaps this game simply indicated that the Kitchen Krew are finally on the rise, after several years in the dumper.

The game was splendidly close with the teams tied at the half and after the third quarter as well. John Larose began the scoring for Corrigan with a TD in the first quarter and added another later in the game. Brent Ferguson, still several light years ahead of his nearest rival in league scoring, tallied a second quarter major and Mark Milton added another in the fourth. Hugo Dittfach contributed a two-point convert to the Corrigan total.

**Karry Kitchen offensive star Garry Hulbert** paced his team to eventual victory with a pair of touchdowns. Doug Gillespie, Paul Burroughs and Jim Taggart also scored Kitchen Krew TD's. Duanne Wilson and Scott "philosopher" Murray grabbed two more. Wilson and Ian McIver hurt the Corrigan attack with interceptions.

**Longhorns vs. North Halton Sports**  
The newly structured herd offence shone again on Sunday, easily subduing Halton Sports with a five touchdown blitz.

Paul McKracken, Bill Taylor, Mark Hamilton and Wayne Doell scored Longhorn touchdowns. Hamilton also grabbed a two point convert.

North Halton started well and scored a pair of TDs in the first half by Bill Fournier and Mark Shultz. The cattle threw a blanket over the sports in the second half however, not allowing them to score.

Best game next week should be the Longhorn - Corrigan match at 8:45. Corrigan, though surprise losers to Karry Kitchens this week will likely be fired up for the Longhorn match. They've proven with their win over Dairy Queen, that they can beat the big teams.

**Greeks vs. Norval**

Like Dairy Queen the Greek offence operated with their first string quarterback at the helm and accordingly put only 20 points on the board against the weak Norval squad. Les Starr, Rob Rivers, Dan Reynolds, and Jim Baldwin recorded Greek majors. Rick Baldwin, relegated to the receiving corps due to a sore throwing arm, scored a two point convert and Dean Scallen stumbled into another two points. Doug Getty intercepted a Norval pass.

For Norval, only Bill Davis was able to score, with a TD in the first quarter. After that, the Norval offence sputtered and ground to a halt.

**Dairy Queen vs. Peel County Bandits**  
The absence of both their first and second string quarterbacks hurt

Dairy Queen on this day. The normally potent Queen offence was rendered ordinary, but they still found enough points to beat the winless Bandits.

Jeff Lockwood, Gary Lockwood and Randy Lunn scored Dairy Queen touchdowns. Jeff Lockwood also hoofed a field goal in the first quarter and Dan Martin tallied a two point convert.

Peel County played perhaps their best game of a dismal season. Down only 9-0 at the half, they came out and matched Dairy Queen TD production in the second half. Bob Klavkals and Wes Samis scored majors. Scott John - Bevins put the damper on the Queen attack with a pair of interceptions. Bob Klavkals picked off another wayward Queen pass.
