

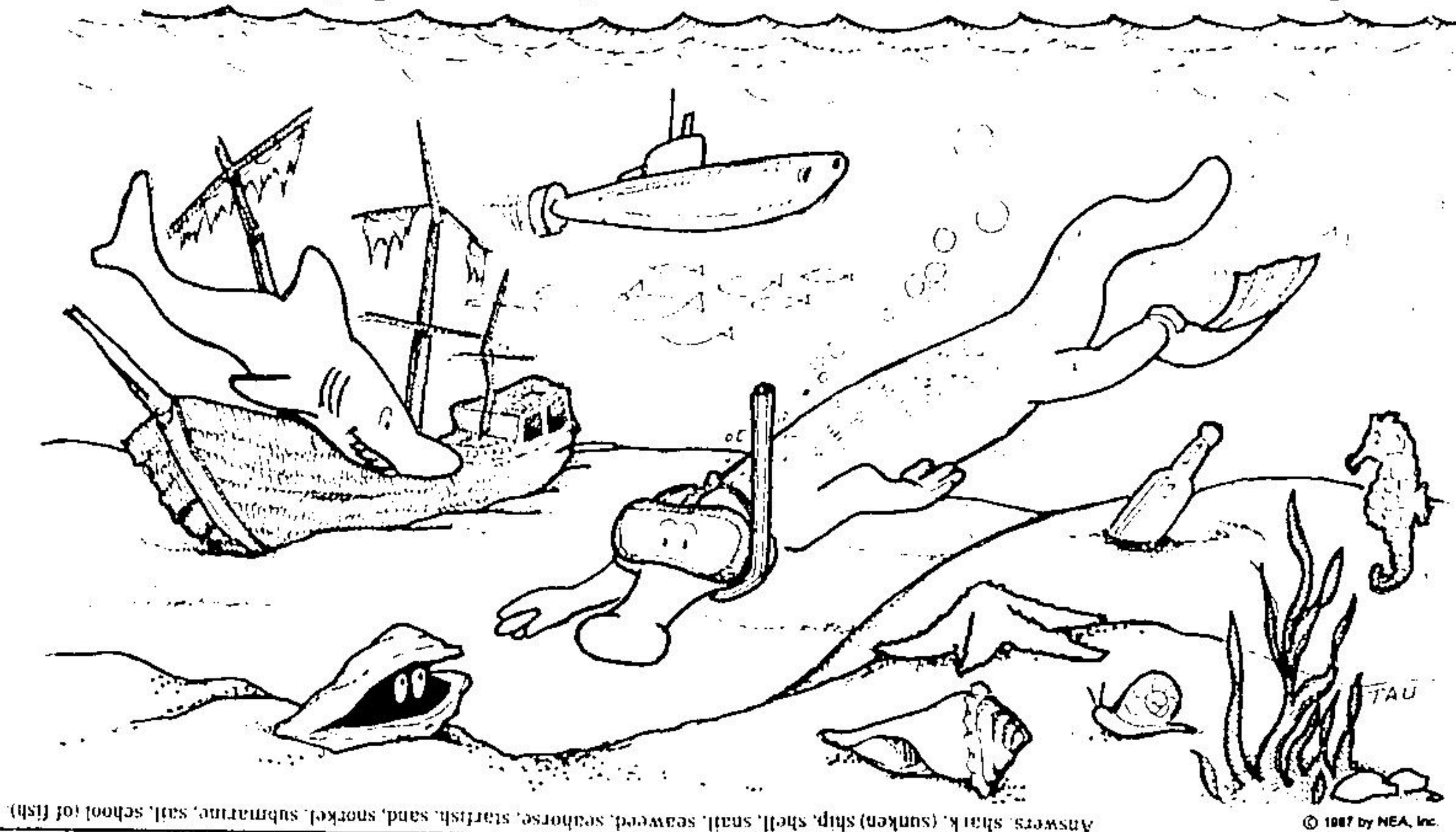

1. The first successful submarine was built in 1620 by a Dutch scientist. The craft consisted of a rowboat covered with waterproofed animal skins.
2. In 1960, a submarine named Triton made history by traveling around the world underwater.
3. The first known submarine attack on a warship was made in 1776 by an American submarine named The Turtle. The Turtle was a one-man, hand-eranked vessel. The attack, which was unsuccessful, took place in New York harbor and was against a British warship during the Revolutionary War.
4. Modern submarines are capable of traveling over 30 miles an hour underwater, and are capable of staying underwater for months at a time.

Sea Search

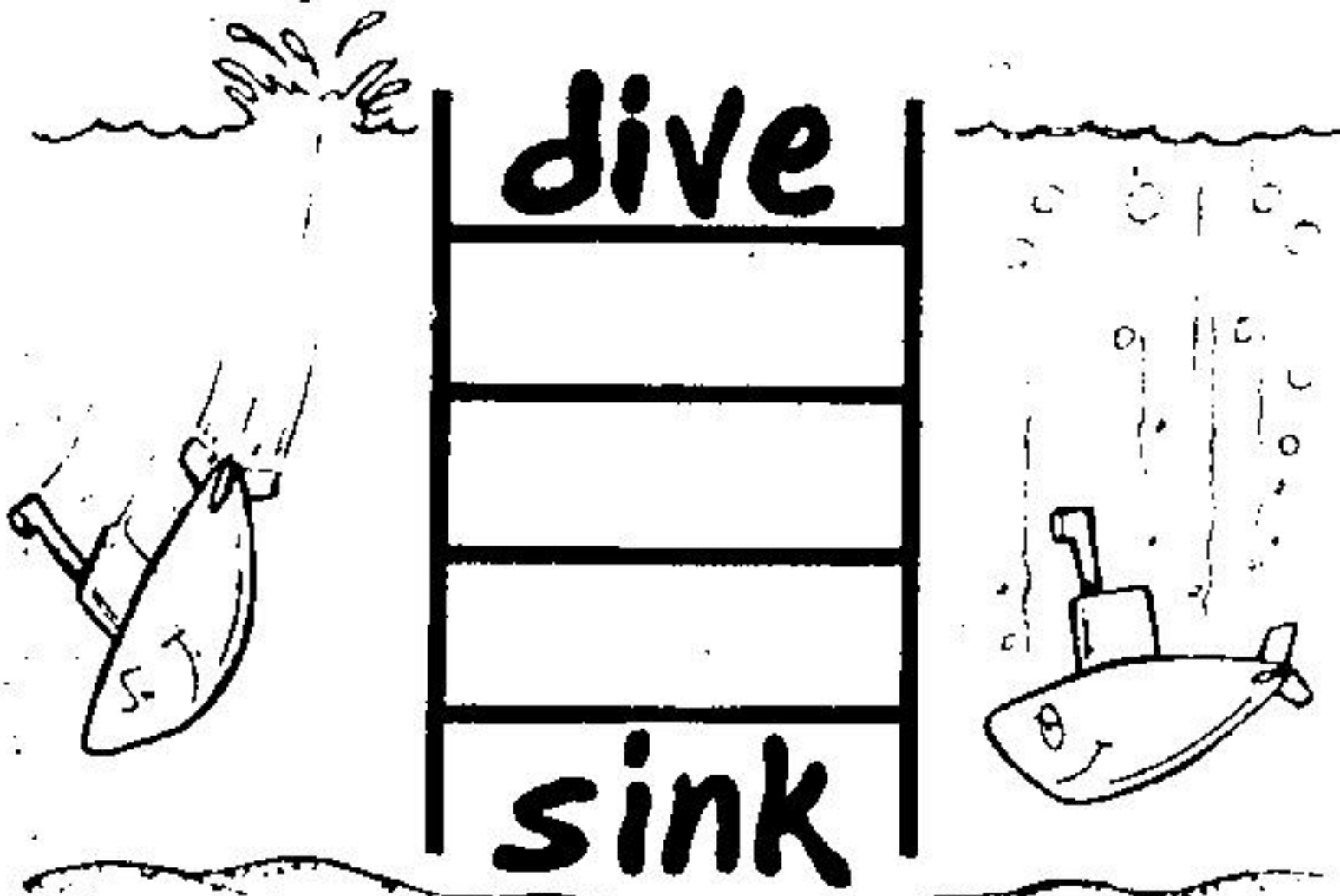
Alfie Alligator is enjoying some underwater fun. Find nine things which begin with the letter "s."



Answers: shark, (sunken) ship, shell, snail, seaweed, seahorse, startfish, sand, snorkel, submarine, sail, school (of fish)

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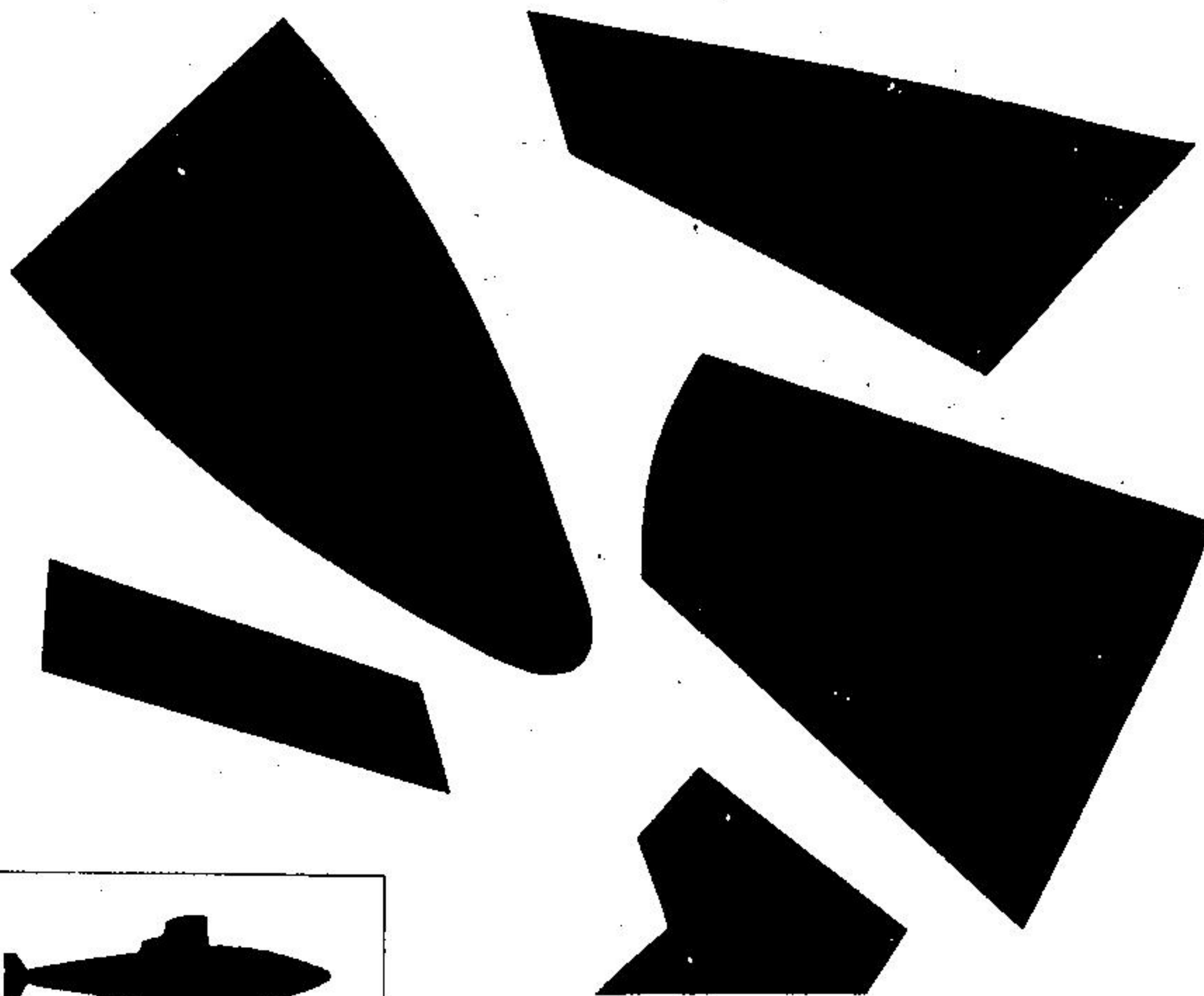

Cut out the shapes below and fit them together to form the shape of a submarine as shown.



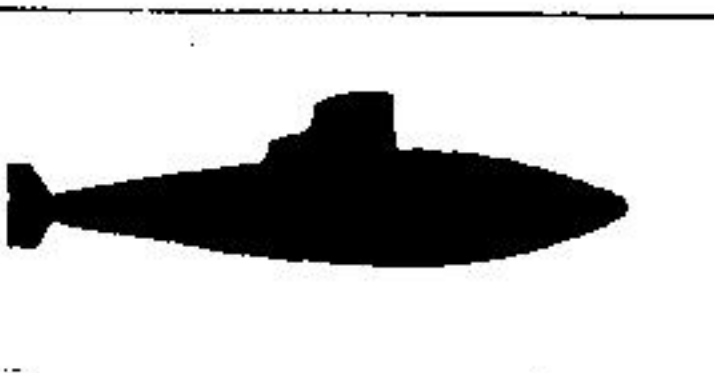
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Math Teaser
