## Playoffs begin in over-30 league

The Georgetown Over-30 Hockey League opened post season play Tuesday night with three round robin games.

In the first game, Kentners edged Dave's Service Centre by a 6-4 margin. The Pontiac Fieros defeated Choice Air 5-1, and in the nitecap, the high-flying McGibbon Hawks blanked the Midas Top Guns 18-0.

Round robin play resumes next week and continues until all teams have played each other once. At that point, the two teams with the best records, will square off in a single game to decide the league champion.

Kentners opened the first period quickly, grabbing a fast 3-0 lead on two goals by Donnie Parker and a third from Al Hay. Dave's Service was, however, able to regroup and narrowed the lead to 3-2 late in the first period and tied the game up early in the second. Kentners took a 4-3 lead late in the period only to have Dave's again tie the game in the third. Midway through the period, Donnie Parker scored his fourth goal of the game to give Kentners the lead for good. Guy Lemay finished up the scoring, deflecting the game's final tally, with only 16 seconds remaining in the game, into the empty net. Scorers for Dave's Service included Jim Gilham (2 goals, 1 assist), Don Blewett (1 goal, 2 assists), Neil McLean (1 goal), Marty Weaven (2 assists) and Dave Wolburn (1 assist).

In game two Brent Ladds opened the scoring for the Fieros but Chris Tennant tied it less than a minute later on a nice setup by Gord Williams. Grant Bodnar scored to give the Fieros a 2-1 lead after two periods. In the third the Pontiac
