Dan Aykroyd is Sgt. Joe Friday, nephew of the original Friday. His new partner is Pep Streebek, played to Tom Hanks. Together they set out to solve the PAGAN crimes that are plaguing Los Angeles. Their chief of police is Bill Gannon, who was Uncle Joe's partner. Harry Morgan reprises his T.V. role as Gannon. Thankfully Jack Webb is not around to see this tedious parody of his show.

There are several reasons why this movie does not work. For one thing the script is really silly, and the dialogue is not at all funny. Another problem is the character of Joe Friday.

Aykroyd plays Friday completely straight - Friday is supposed to be Jack Webb thrown into the 80's L.A.,

still just asking for the facts. This does not work at all. Aykroyd is boring; Friday is played as a knee-jerk reactionary, a virginal thirty-five year old without a shred of humour and pretty stupld to boot. The original Friday was not any of these things - he got the job done and he wasn't an idiot. Aykroyd should stick to T.V. - he has never been as funny in films as he was on Saturday Night Live.

Tom Hanks is given the thankless task of being Aykroyd's foil. Pep's casual attitude is supposed to contrast with Friday's conservatism. Unfortunately, since the Friday character is a dead loss, Streebek is left high and dry. Hanks has no chance here to display his comic talents. He has only a very few good lines; by the time he gets to them the audlence is too comatose to bother to laugh.
