The following day, Georgetown had to travel to Strathroy for a double header to decide the issue. The Midgets jumped out to an 8-0 lead, but then they sat back and watched as Strathroy came back to win 11-9.

The team once again received strong hitting, this time from the likes of John Brooker, Abad Mora, and Andy Domingos, who had a single and a double each.

The pitching was handled by Travis Gardiner and a limping Nap Benito.

With their numbers thinned considerably, due to injuries and players away for vacation, Georgetown went into the second game to face a do-or-die situation.

In what appears to have been a brilliant move, Manager Al Gardiner started Yaroschak on the mound, possibly launching the young man's pitching career.

The move paid off in a big way, as Georgetown went on to win the game 11-9, and take the series.

Once again, the Georgetown bats were strong, led by a three-run home run by Kester, and two doubles and two singles by Williams Mora and Rob Ross also chipped in with a pair of hits each.

The Lions' Midgets next opponent in the OBA playoffs was slated to be Wyoming.

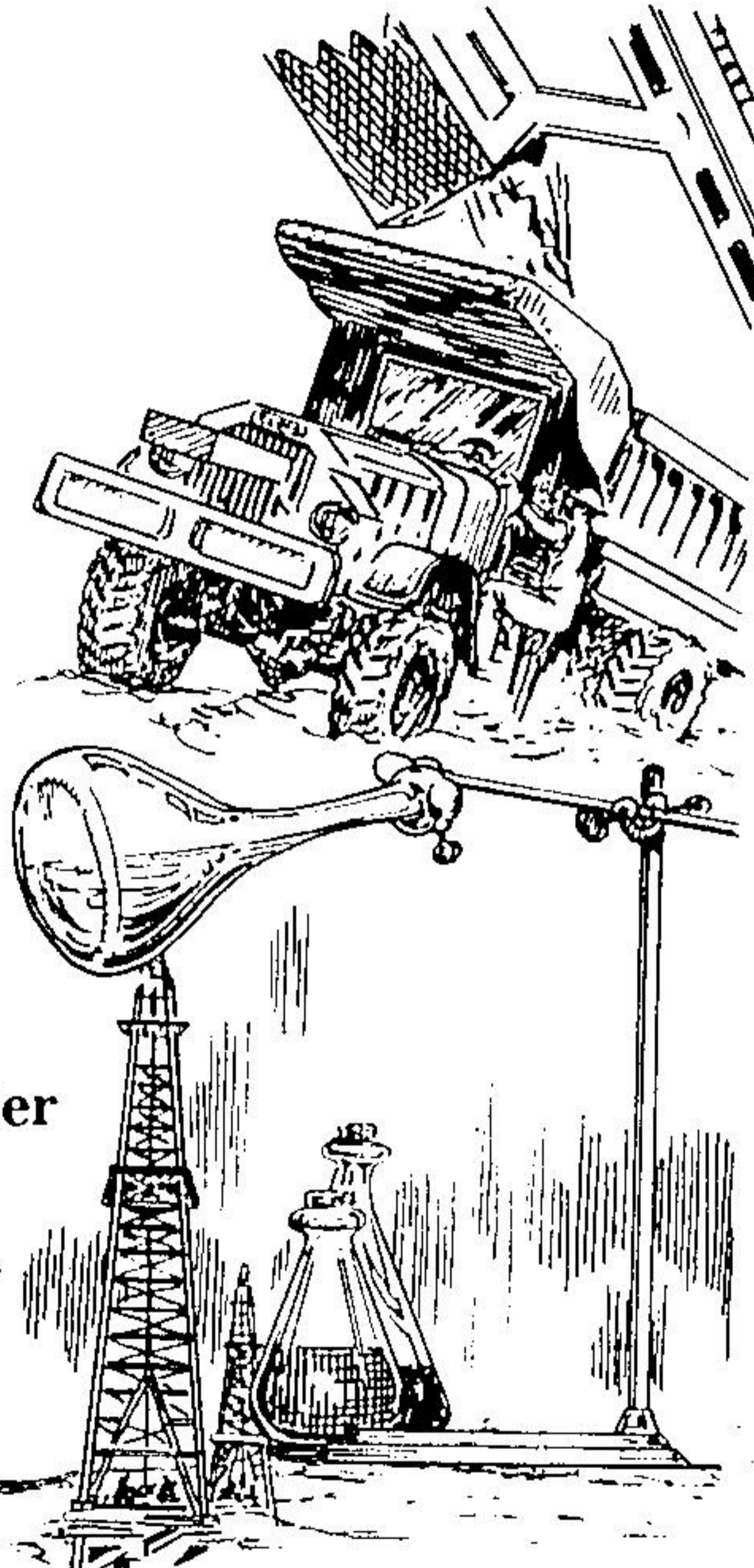
