A Tasty Recipe

DELICIOUS PEAR CONSERVE

6 cups pears 1 cup crushed pineapple

1 orange 1 lemon

41/2 cups sugar 3 pieces ginger root

Peel, core and dice pears finely. Drain the crushed pineapple well. Grate rind from the orange and lemon and squeeze juice from both. Combine the prepared pears, pineapple, grated rind and fruit juice with the sugar. Add ginger. Heat gently to the bolling point, stirring to dissolve the sugar. Cook gently until mixture has thickened, about 40 minutes. Remove pieces of ginger and seal conserve in hot sterilized
