## Police beat

### Coins stolen

A collection of old and foreign coins were stolen from a home at the Sixth Line and 10 Sideroad between Friday and Monday. The thief entered through a basement window. No value has been placed on the stolen coins yet, police said.

### Sign vandals

A wooden sign was pried off a door at Audio Electronics, 130 Guelph St., Georgetown between Saturday night and Sunday. Total damage to the door is estimated at \$80. There was no attempt to enter the building, police said. The sign was later found at the corner of Mill and Main Streets.

### Cars damaged

A 29-year-old Georgetown male has been arrested in connection with the willful damage of three cars on Pennington Cres. At 45 Pennington, the hoods of two cars were walked over and a back window broken on one of the vehicles. Total damage to the three cars is

estimated at \$850. The man has been charged with mischief under \$1000. He will appear in court September 28.

### Camping theft

Camping equipment, worth about \$550, was stolen from a parked car in Glen Williams Saturday. The theft occurred between 12:30 and 8 a.m. at the corner of Karen Drive and Confederation Street. The stolen goods include a tent, sleeping bags, a stove and a cooler.

### Stereo taken

After midnight Tuesday, someone broke into Georgetown Custom Car Sound at 55 Sinclair Ave., and stole a stereo valued at \$750. The front glass door was smashed and the class cabinet containing the stereo was also broken. Total damage is estimated at \$400.
