Bowling season set to get rolling

This signals the new 1987-88 five-pin bowling season at the only bowling centre in Georgetown.

This yell was especially true for a bantam girl, Robin Zander, who came out with her grandmother, Friede Zander, who bowls in the Golden Age League. She rolled her highest 200 game and the next time out topped it with her first 300 game.

Many older youth bowlers and even adults wish that they could do it at least once during the season. Robin will come out with other youth bowlers aged four to 19-years-old every Saturday morning where they will obtain expert instruction by "Master Bowlers" and coaches of previous Canadian medal achievers Ralph Miller, Wendy Parent, Andy Parent, Gord Lane, Carolyn Lane together with Julie McCorry and seniors Robin MacLeod, Sandy Weeks and Dee Dee Haynes. Right now, registrations are being accepted while the weeks of basic instructions are going on before the bowlers will be formed into competitive teams. The senior YBC group has to progress faster as entries for their first tournament, the Senior Mixed Provincial Champion-

ship, have to be in by Oct. 4.

With most adult leagues expanding, they require a few more participants, both experienced and beginning bowlers for men's and ladies' and mixed leagues.

There are leagues for all, such as Mon. Nite Men's; Tues. afternoon

and Wed. afternoon Ladies League; and Wed. Evening League; and mixed leagues such as Club Troubadour (Sun. Nite French-Canadian); D.R.G.; Christian Reformed Church; Mon. Nite Social; Tues. Nite; Wed Mixed Social; Dmtar; Fri. Nite Social; and Golden Age (Fri. After-noon).
