

Clarke's entries won the reserve grand champion bull class, senior champion female, grand champion female, get of sire, premier breeders's banner and a host of first and second-place ribbons.

"You come with what you have and do what you can," Clarke said with a shrug of his shoulders shortly after leaving the winner's circle. Last year Clarke's entry won the champion bull award, among other top-place wins.

A 25-year veteran of CNE shorthorn competitions, Clarke

brought seven of the 70 head of cattle on his Georgetown farm to the exhibition's cow palace. Although the competition lasted only a day, Clarke's cattle were on exhibit for four days, giving city dwellers a taste of the country.


