Emmerson Clark**

Georgetown shorthorn breeder Emmerson Clarke came and conquered with his entries in the Canadian National Exhibition's cattle competitions Monday.

Clarke's entries won the reserve grand champion bull class, senior champion female, grand champion female, get of sire, premier breeders' banner and a host of first and second-place ribbons.

"You come with what you have and do what you can," Clarke said with a shrug of his shoulders shortly after leaving the winner's circle.

Last year Clarke's entry won the champion bull award, among other top-place wins.

A 25-year veteran of CNE shorthorn competitions, Clarke

brought seven of the 70 head of cattle on his Georgetown farm to the exhibition's cow palace. Although the competition lasted only a day, Clarke's cattle were on exhibit for four days, giving city dwellers a taste of the country.

He described this year's competition as "not quite as large as last year, but some real good quality" entries. Although the CNE has its share of winners, it still can't beat the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair for quality and competitiveness, he adds.

"The Royal," he explains with a nod of his head, "is the real agricultural show."

Nonetheless, the CNE gives breeders a chance to display their animals and, hopefully, interest some buyers. —Toronto Bureau
