- 7. Remove the engine cover and wipe the engine clean of all debris.
- 8. Remove and replace the air filter. and make sure the spark plug is operat-
- 9. Wipe the unit clean and spray a protective lubricant on all hoses, wires and working parts.
- 10. Replace the cutting blade, and make sure it is sufficiently tightened and properly balanced.


- Floors and Basement Walls: Check for adequate insulation under crawl spaces and around basement areas. The recommended insulation level for these areas is R-19.
- · Windows and Doors: Consider installing storm windows and doors to keep warm air in and cold air out. In winter, keep curtains and shades open to let warm sunshine in during the day but close them when the sun goes down.
- · Weatherstripping/Caulking: Warm air can escape through cracks around doors, windows and other openings, such as pipes and ducts. Seal these escape routes
- Thermostat: Set between 65 and 70

degrees Fahrenheit during the day and five degrees lower while you're asleep. Consider installing an automatic clock thermostat, which will lower the temperature automatically after you go to bed, and raise it just before you get up. You can save up to 12 percent on heating costs with such a device.

· Trees and Shrubs: Plant trees and shrubs near your home to break the force of the wind, especially on the north side.

· Heating System: Clean your furnace and replace filter as needed. Close heating vents in unused rooms. Consider installing devices which can increase the efficiency of your existing system.

· Water System: Try a lower thermostat setting and consider an insulation warp. Install water flow restrictors in showers and faucets.
