

# Walk-a-thon Sunday

This Sunday afternoon Halton Hills residents will walk, run bicycle and skateboard to help raise money for the United Way. The first annual United Way of Halton Hills Walk-A-Thon involves a four kilometre and 8 kilometre route, both of which start and finish at the Co-op Guelph Street.

The walk-a-thon is a joint effort by the United Way and the Kwanis of Georgetown. The Kwanis came forward with their expertise and manpower to help plan and run the walk-a-thon. All pledges raised this Sunday will go to the United Way of Halton Hills. This year's fund raising goal is \$140,000 a 50 per cent in-

crease over the amount raised last year. The money raised will be used to fund the United Way's Red Cross Partners and its 17 member agencies.

Registration for the walk gets underway at 1 p.m. at the Co-op. The

first 50 people to register will receive early bird prizes. The adult who turns in the most money will win a prize donated by a Toronto hotel. The adult award is a week end for two at Loews Westbury Hotel. The prize for the child who brings in the most pledges is a \$200 gift certificate donated by the Halton Hills law firm of Nelson, Kogon, Ashbee and Schaljo.

The W. Neilson Company Ltd. of Georgetown has donated refreshments for walk-a-thon participants and the Georgetown Volunteer Ambulance will be on hand in case of any emergencies.




