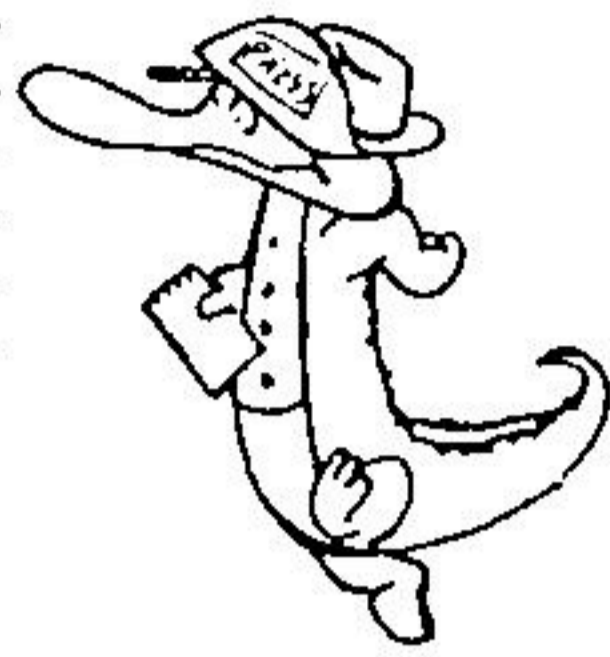

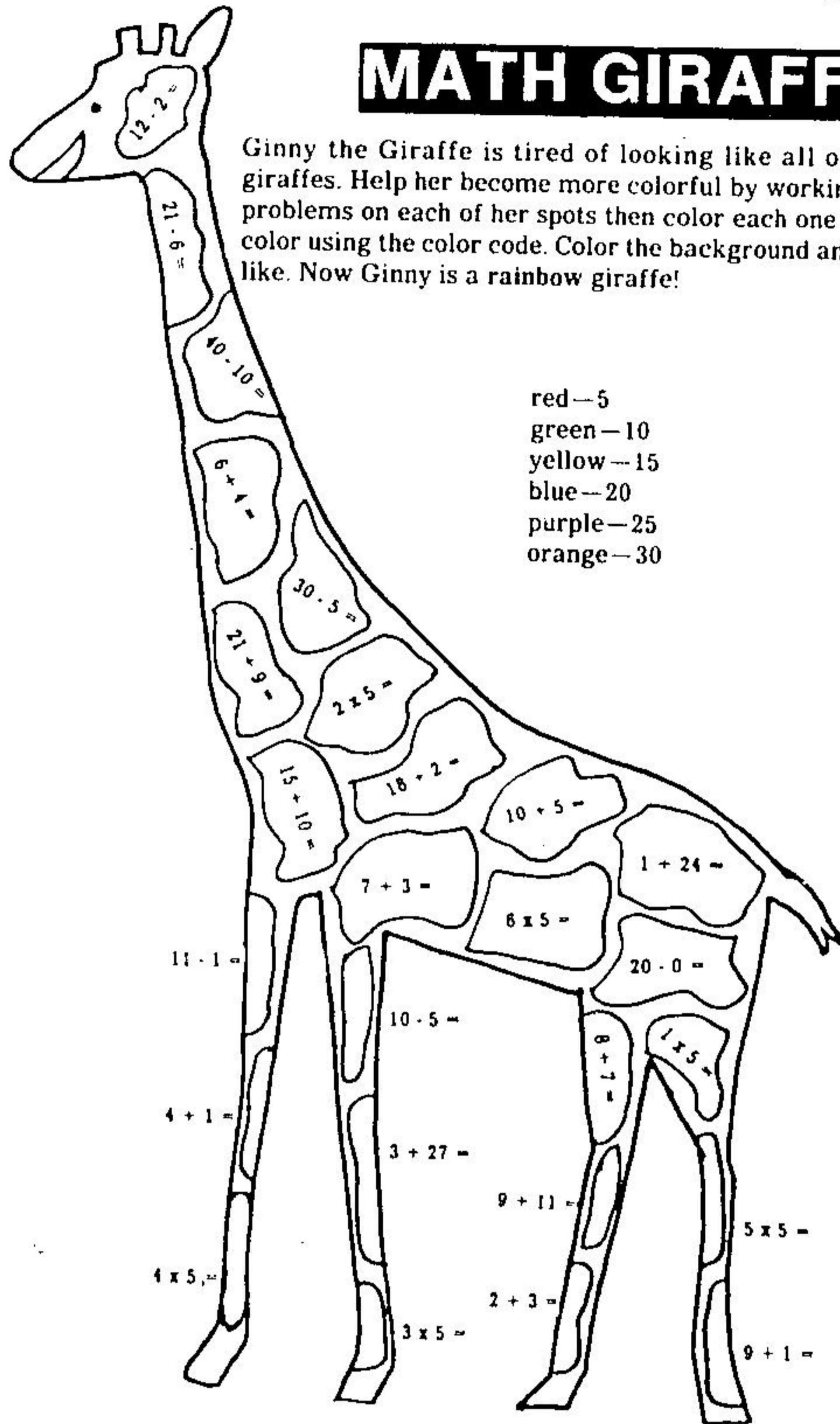

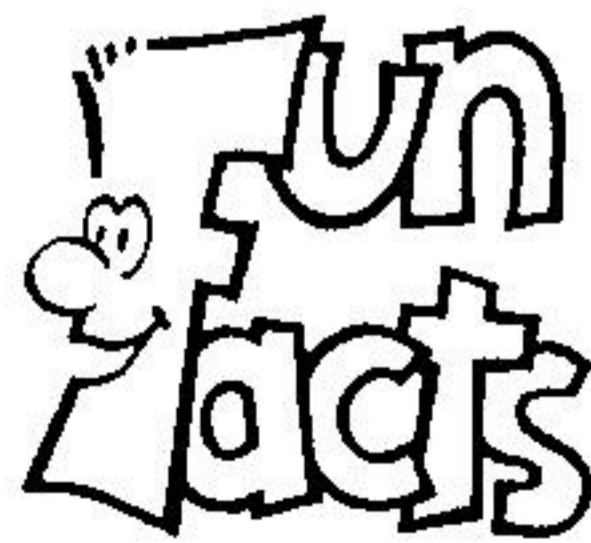
## MATH GIRAFFE
