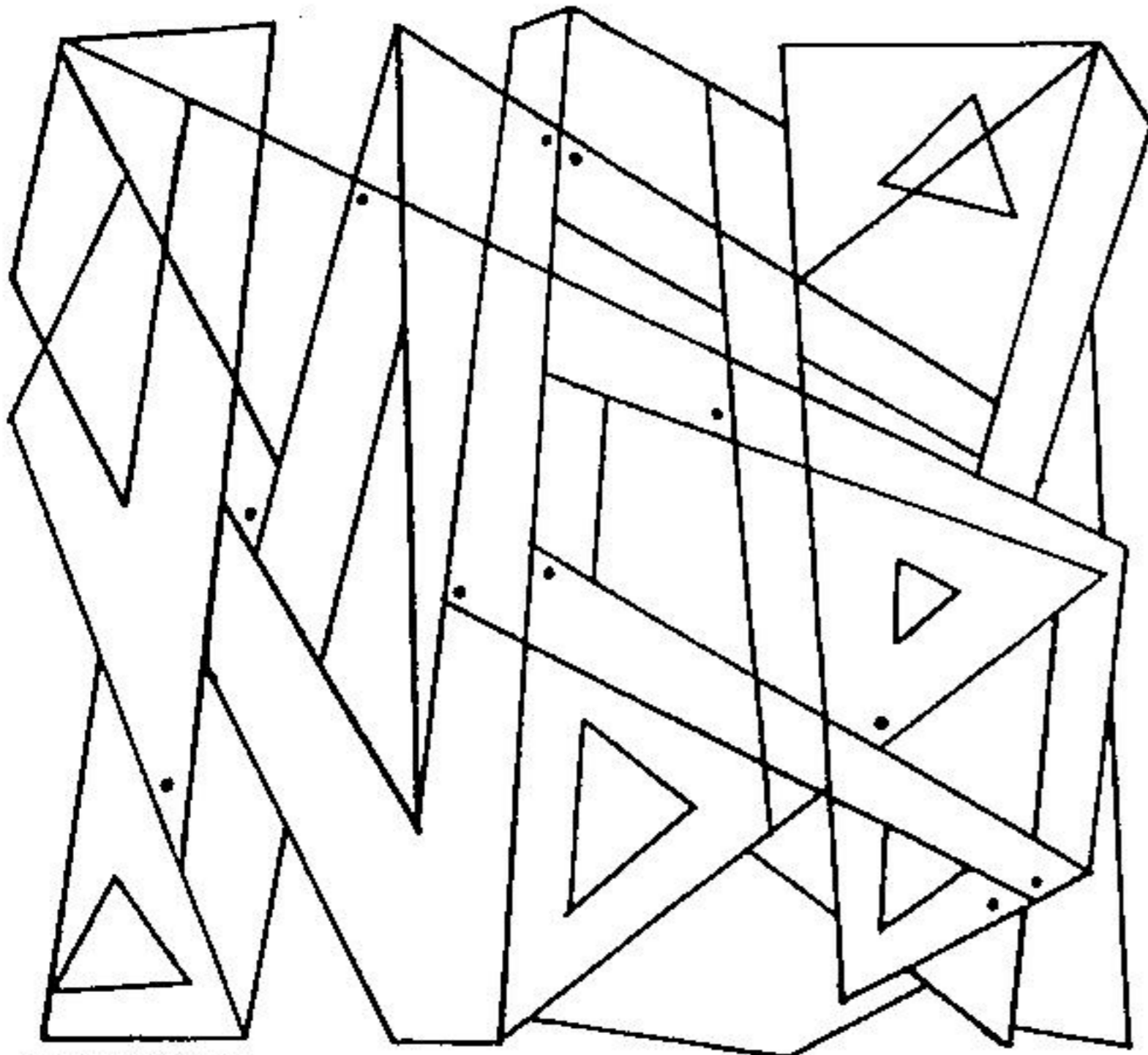
Below are 12 words, all mixed up. Put them in proper order and you'll have an interesting sentence about spiders.

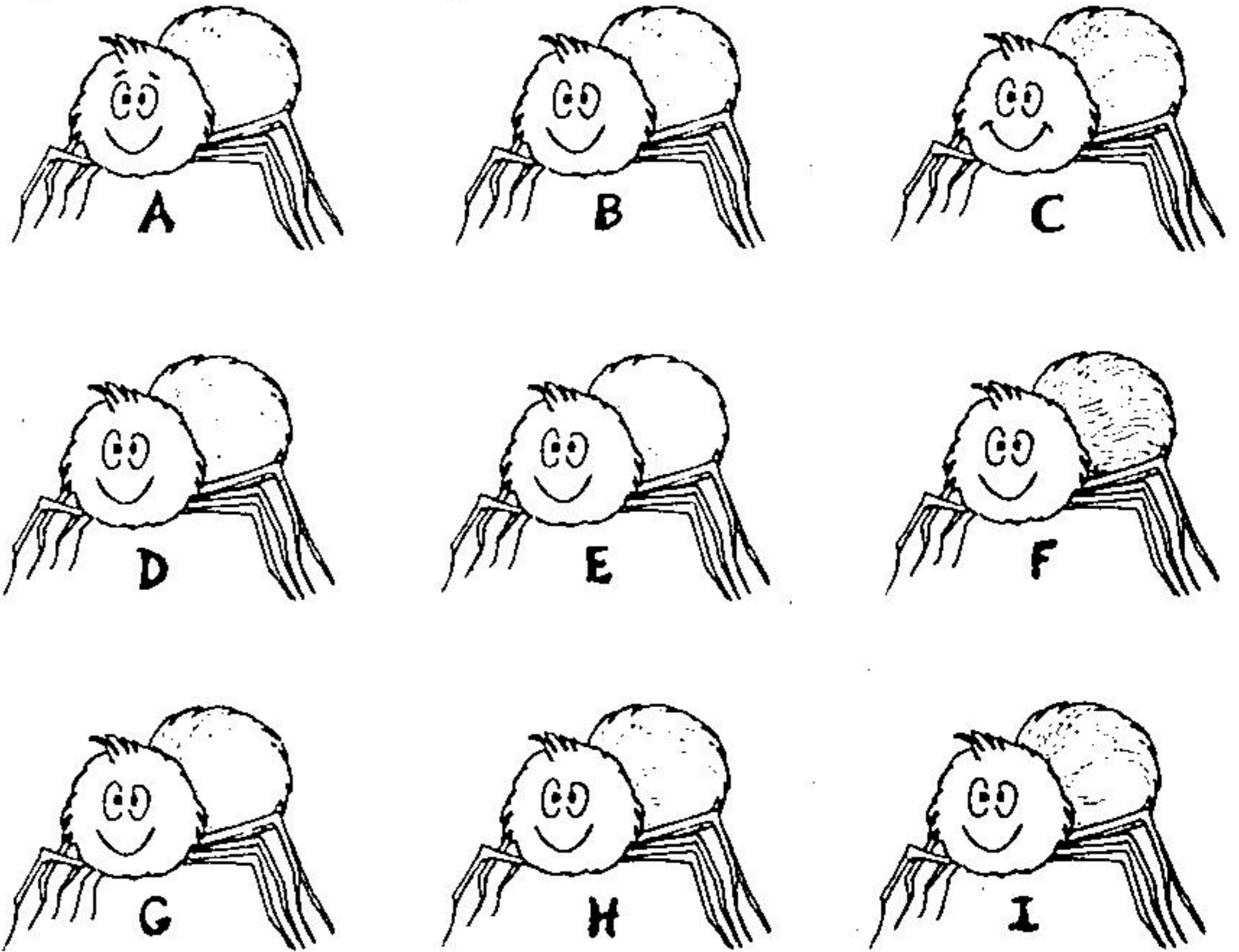

Only two of these spiders are exactly alike. Can you spot the twins?

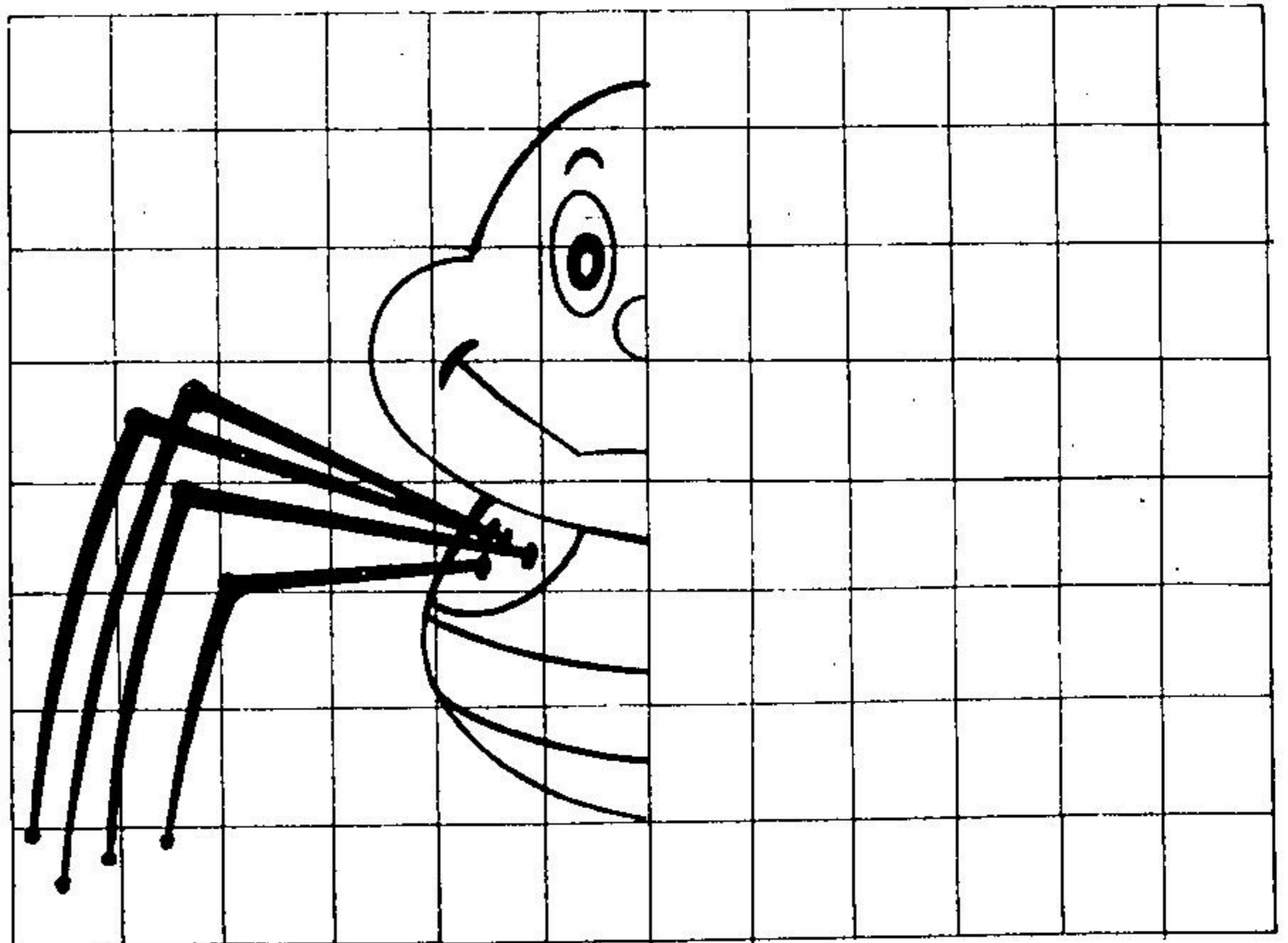
