### Alan Trammell is player of the year

NEW YORK (NEA) - Detroit Tiger shortstop Alan Trammell, the top all-around star at one of the game's Association. toughest positions, has been named the 1987 World Almanac Player of the Year in major-league baseball.

Trammell, 29, was chosen No. 1 among the top players at each of the regular blg-league positions. Also named to the World Almanac team were two starting pitchers, a relief pitcher and a designated hitter.

A veteran of 10 full seasons with Detroit, Trammell put up solid numbers this season - 28 home runs, 105 RBIs and a .343 batting average for the American League East champs. He scored 109 runs and stole 21 bases.

The second annual World Almanac All-Major League Baseball Team was chosen by a panel of sports experts. Their selections were made on behalf of the World Almanac, which is co-

sponsored by 140 newspapers, and its publisher, Newspaper Enterprise

Here are the 1986 winners:

First Base: Don Mattingly. This New York Yankee dominates even in, for him, an off-year (30 HRs, 115 RBIs, .327 batting average). Mattingly hit a record six grand slams in 1987, and tied another record by homering in eight straight games. He did it all while missing 21 games; he was bothered by a hand injury.

Second Base: Juan Samuel. It wasn't a great year for second basemen. Samuel of the Philadelphia Phillies can be sloppy with his glove but seldom with his bat or feet. His '87 numbers (28 HRs, 100 RBIs, .272 batting average; plus 113 runs and 35 stoposition.

Shortstop: Alan Trammell. Tough call. After all, Ozzie Smith, who has counterpart.
