100 acres farmland rejected for housing

Ron Pinkney has lost his Ontario Municipal Board appeal.

In a bid to build ten residential dwellings on Part Lot 10, Concession 6 in Georgetown Mr. Pinkney asked the OMB to defer sections of the Regional Official Plan and the Halton Hills Official Plan.

That would leave the Esquing Official Plan in effect for the land. Mr. Pinkney also asked the OMB for an amendment to the Esquing Official Plan.

He then wanted to rezone the lot

from Rural to Estate Residential. The OMB found the Regional and municipal official plans to be in effect, thus prohibiting the development.

The 100 acre property is located on prime agricultural land, the Board found.

A Ministry of Agriculture and Food spokesman said the land "constituted the largest and uninterrupted block of good agricultural

land in Halton Hills and that to permit this parcel to be divided into non-farm residences, irrespective of whether or not it was good agricultural land, would be wrong."

The Board agreed with that statement.

The Board agreed that the best agricultural land in the area lies below the Niagara Escarpment where the proposed development is located.

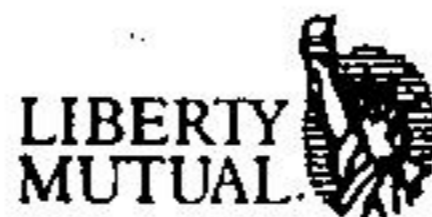
