Rebel hoopsters take doubleheader

The Georgetown District High School Senior Rebels strolled to a 32-18 victory over Loyola Wednesday afternoon, in girl's high school basketball action.

In the second half of a doubleheader at GDHS, the Junior Rebels fell behind early but bounced back to take a 45-30 decision from the Bishop Reding Royals.

Tuesday's game for the Senior Rebels came only two days after their impressive victory over rival Acton High School in a contest to decide the first place team, so it's understandable the Rebels lacked a little intensity against Loyola.

"It was hard to get the girls motivated," said coach Moe Leeking following the victory. "When they're not motivated, they get sloppy. They were pretty drained emotionally from the game Monday, because it was such an emotional and physical game.

The Rebels defeated Acton in the earlier match to keep their unbeaten record intact.

For Acton, it was their first taste of defeat in the regular schedule.

The Rebels travel to Acton this Monday for a rematch in their emotional roller coaster ride.

"It's a great rivalry, and we're getting psyched up for it," he says, "We like to run, and they play a more walk-up game. It's a matter of who can draw the other team into playing their type of game."

Leeking feels a lower scoring game will be more Acton's advantage, since they rely heavily on only a few players for most of their scoring. He thinks the advantage will be in Georgetown's favor in a high-scoring shootout because of the Rebel's depth. "We'll try to get the tempo back up for the next game."

Against Loyola, the Rebels enjoyed lead of 18-12 at half time. Heather Lawrence led the scoring attack for GDHS as she hit for 14 points. Other scorers included Lisa

Mason and Kim Daquano, with four points each, Jenny Melville and Shanna Long with three apiece, and Lisa Carter and Allison Irvine, who both added two points.

In the Junior match-up, Bishop Reding held a lead of 10-4 after the opening quarter.

But the Rebels settled down completely controlled matters in the second quarter, outscoring the visitors 18-0, to take a 22-10 halftime lead.

Kelly Cotton hit 14 points for the Rebeis, while Sheri Nairn contributed 12. Melanie Jans and Stacey Sproule each clicked for six points, Holly Sones added three, Jen Halsall and Sarah Broughton had two each, and Sherril Cave had one.

For the Royals, Michelle Durante led the scoring with 12 points, while Bridget McCauley had eight, Anna Petrilli added four, and Marianne Longo, Sara Cooke, and Marg Eidt each had two.




