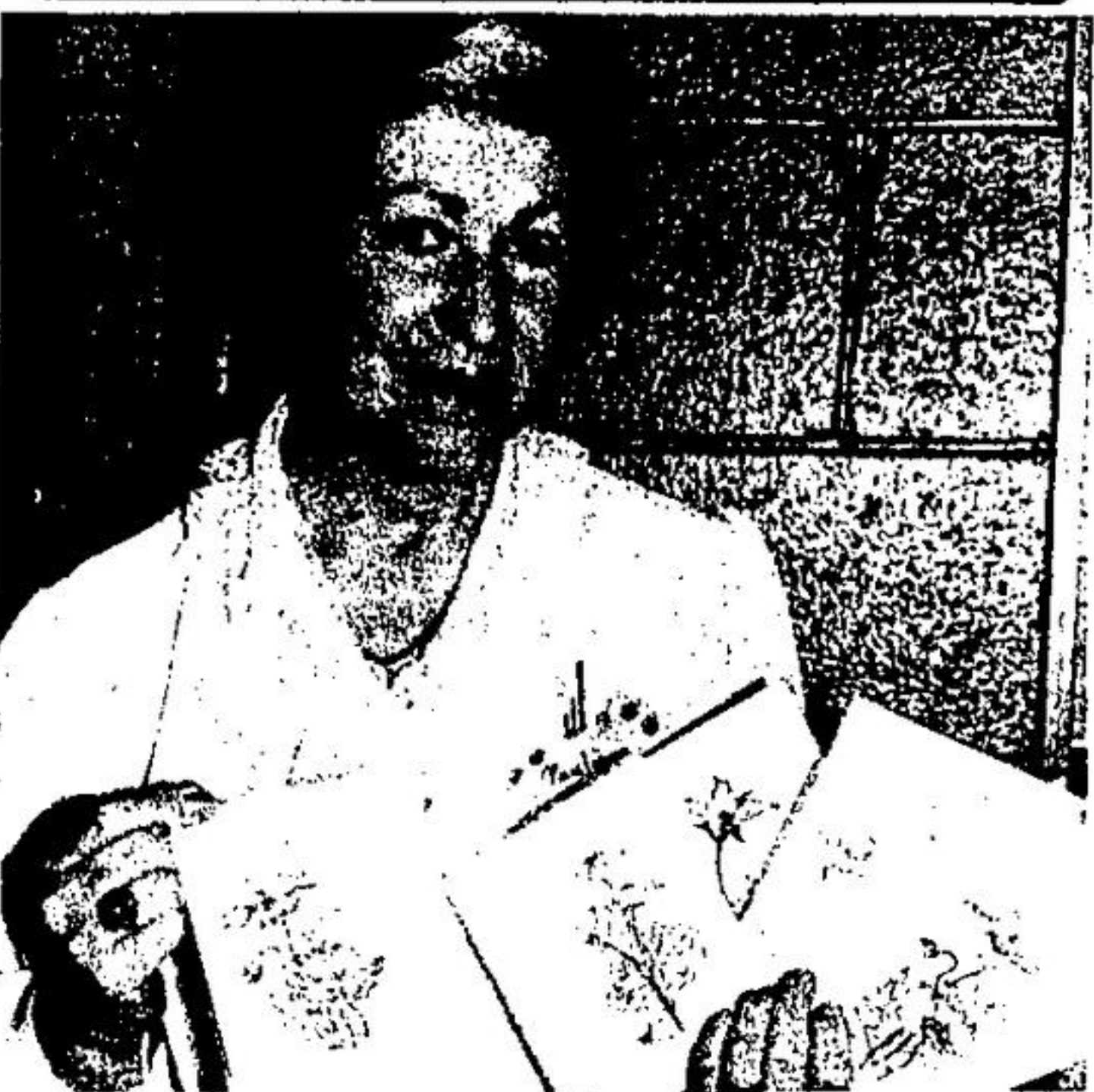

This presentation will be a light musical version of the classic Christmas story of the miserly old Ebenezer Scrooge, and how he was made to change his way of life after he is visited by the three spirits of Christmas Past, Christmas Present and Christmas to Come.

Director Ron Hunt already has many ideas flitting through his mind regarding sets, costumes, chorus movement and such. He is looking forward to the selection of a cast to portray the many different characters, and to the fun of molding them into a professional looking show. As is usual with the GLT Christmas show, auditions are not restricted to the membership but are open to everyone. Allyson states that Lois comes out in her portrayal of Blanca in The Taming of the Shrew, however there is a humorous contrast.

Playing opposite Allyson is Ron Cheney who characterizes the roles of Bill, in the backstage play, and as Lucentio, in The Taming of the Shrew. Ron is returning to Globe after a five year absence - his previous show with Globe was Oklahoma.

Ron states that many of the Globe participants are new however, the group continues its wonderful

theatre comradery. Although Ron has been away from Globe, he has not been away from the stage. Since 1978 Ron has been involved in many of the productions staged by Brampton Musical Society.

Ron's favorite show was Pajama Game in which he played the role of Ilmes. Raised in Delhi Ontario, Ron moved to the Brampton area in 1978. He is presently employed as a Library Technician in Bolton.

Ron says that in Kiss Me Kate his Bill character is a "hooper" who is trying Shakespeare for the first time.

He is an irresponsible lad who is out for a good time which includes gambling. Ron explains that, both on and off stage, the Bill character is in love with the same person - Lois. As Lucentio, the Bill traits are still evident and Ron does a wonderful portrayal of both.
