

Haulage costs are equal giving town a subsidy

Until Halton's new landfill site is ready, Halton Hills taxpayers will be relieved of the burden of paying haulage costs to the dump in Burlington.

The Region will equalize all the haulage costs amongst the four municipalities.

The costing works out like this:

Each Halton Hills taxpayer is paying \$67.75 for waste disposal in 1987.

If the Region had decided to expand the existing station and not pick up Halton Hills' haulage costs, taxpayers would have paid \$79.91 in 1988, \$90.99 in 1989 and \$94.29 in 1990. That totals \$265.19 over three years.

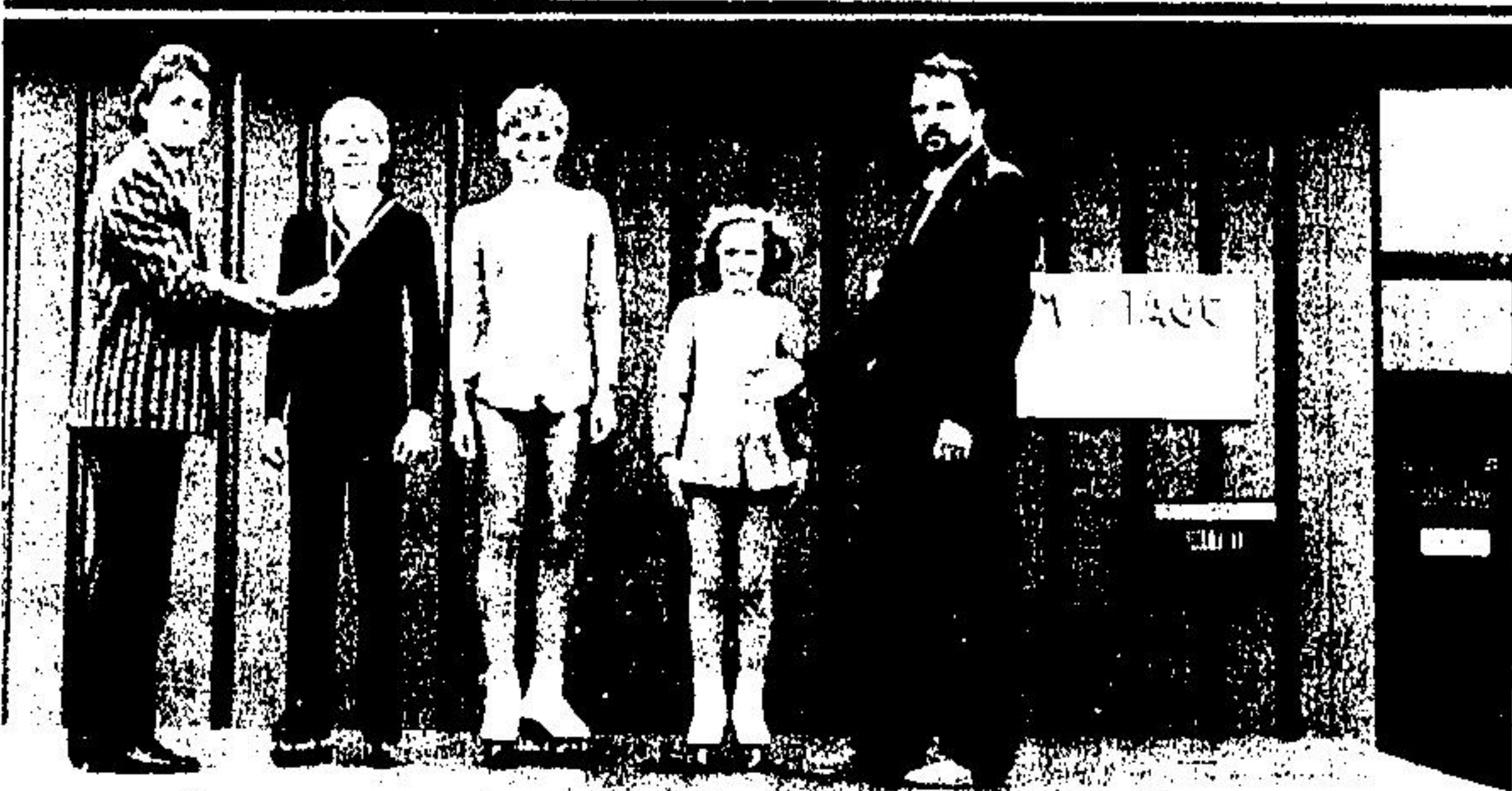
If the Region expanded the existing site and paid

Halton Hills' haulage taxpayers would have paid \$66.15 in 1988, \$76.50 in 1989 and \$80.76 in 1990. That would cost each taxpayer \$223.41 over three years.

Not included in those numbers are the costs of holding an environmental assessment hearing on expansion of the old site. Some councillors say those added costs would negate most of the savings of the proposal.

Under the current deal, with Walker Brothers building a new transfer station in Burlington, Halton Hills taxpayers will pay \$68.82 in 1988, \$80.76 the following year and \$83.90 in 1990. Each Halton Hills taxpayer will pay \$233.48 over three years.

Halton Hills Outlook
